

# Welcome, Odyssey of the Mind World Finals 2025!

Between May 21 and 24, thousands of students, teachers, parents and volunteers from around the globe will travel to Michigan State University for the 45th annual Odyssey of the Mind World Finals. It's an educational competition whose mission is to provide creative problem-solving opportunities for students from kindergarten through college.

Rotating between MSU and Iowa State University every other year, the OOTM World Finals give our community a multi-million-dollar boost as participants patronize local hotels, restaurants, retail shops, businesses and tourist attractions.

As trusted partners of OOTM, Michigan Flyer and our parent company, Indian Trails, will play a key role in making it a success. Together, we have dozens of buses ready to transport thousands of participants between Detroit Metro Airport and East Lansing.

#### What It's All About

Competing at MSU will be up to 800 teams of seven members each, whose performance will be assessed by hundreds of volunteer judges. Each team chooses one of <u>these competitive problems</u> to solve under the guidance of an adult coach.

Teams from states across the U.S.—including Michigan—have been working on their solutions all year and previously reached championship status through competitions at the state level. So have their international counterparts.

Among the nations who've previously sent their best students are Argentina, Austria, Canada, China, Germany, Greece, Hong Kong, Hungary, India, Japan, Korea, Mexico, Poland, Qatar, Romania, Russia, Singapore, South Korea, Switzerland, and the United Kingdom. However, due to America's current political climate of mass deportations and international trade wars, it remains to be seen which countries will be represented at MSU this year.

Regardless, the Odyssey kids will fill MSU's residence and dining halls, and form lifelong friendships with both teammates and opponents from around the globe. Ultimately, on Saturday, May 24, at MSU's Breslin Center, 19 teams in various age groups will be named World Champions of Creative Problem-Solving.

If you happen to see any OOTM participants wearing their distinctive T-shirts on the streets of Lansing or East Lansing, we encourage you to extend a very warm welcome.

# **Spirit Airlines Expands to Give You 40+ Nonstop Destinations from DTW**



Florida-based <u>Spirit Airlines</u> has come roaring back into competition with other major carriers after emerging from years of losses, debt, failed mergers, and <u>bankruptcy</u>. It has new financing, new leadership, and a new determination to rebrand itself as a premium airline.

Most importantly for Michigan Flyer passengers, Spirit recently announced 10 new and six resuming nonstop routes from Detroit Metro Airport—all to destinations served by Delta Air Lines. Potentially, the head-to-head competition could mean lower fares for passengers of both carriers.

Starting on various dates in May and June, Spirit's new and resumed destinations from DTW are Austin (AUS), Birmingham (BHM), Charleston (CHS), Hartford (BDL), Louisville (SDF), Kansas City (MCI), Milwaukee (MKE), Norfolk (ORF), Phoenix (PHX), Punta Cana (PUJ), Richmond (RIC), Salt Lake City (SLC), San Diego (SAN), San Juan (SJU), and St. Louis (STL), plus Savannah (SAV) in October.

Overall, these additions will give travelers the choice of 41 nonstop routes from DTW. (To see them all, <u>click here</u>, enter "DTW" in the From box, then click inside the To box.) All are for sale now. In terms of the number of direct flights offered by carriers at Detroit Metro, this will make Spirit second only to Delta.

While visiting Spirit's website, be sure to take note of the <u>new options it offers to customize your on-board experience</u>, ranging from "Go," "Go Savvy," and "Go Comfy," to the first-class "Go Big." As for pricing, see our sample airfares below.

Spring is the perfect time to start planning for a fall vacation. That's because the sooner you plan your getaway, the less expensive your airline tickets are apt to be. Using <u>Skyscanner.com</u>, we spot-checked prices for domestic roundtrips leaving Detroit Metro Airport (DTW) on Friday, Oct. 3, and returning on Sunday, Oct. 12. Among our search criteria: Flights had to be nonstop in both directions, and the return flight had to arrive at DTW in time for passengers to catch our last run at 9:45 or 10 p.m. to Ann Arbor, Brighton and East Lansing.

NOTE: Lower prices than these are usually available for anyone who's flexible about the dates of travel, or willing to change planes enroute to their destinations. Our sample economy roundtrip fares include taxes but not necessarily baggage or other "extras."

# Why Jenascia Scott Chooses Michigan Flyer



When Michigan Flyer was launched in 2006, the idea was to offer a shuttle service to carry folks from East Lansing, and points in between, to Detroit Metro Airport and back.

Over the years, mid-Michigan residents have also found it to be a convenient, cost-effective way to travel to and from the campuses of Michigan State University or the University of Michigan. Students and faculty of MSU and U-M often take the Flyer to visit one another. Others ride it to work and medical appointments, to visit friends and relatives, attend art exhibits and performances, go shopping, and more.

Currently, Jenascia Scott chooses the Flyer as a safe way to travel between Brighton and East Lansing to visit her boyfriend.

### The Advantages

She began riding with us last year at the suggestion of her boyfriend's mother. While Jenascia lives in Redford, Mich., her car wasn't the most reliable. "I felt comfortable driving it to Brighton and leaving it in the parking lot there to hop on the Flyer," she says. Though she has since bought a more reliable car, she still rides the Flyer about once a week.

Jenascia, who recently completed her training as an esthetician at the Douglas J Aveda Institute in Royal Oak, Mich., says she wasn't expecting much when she boarded the Flyer the first time. "I was thinking it would just be an ordinary bus. But the Flyer motorcoaches are so up-to-date, safe, and comfortable."


Other things she appreciates include the professionalism of our drivers, restrooms on board, our bus tracker app that lets passengers see the exact location of their bus in real time, and our customer service staff. "Whenever I've contacted the Flyer office, they're so nice and really work with you to help accommodate your needs," she says.

And while Jenascia has not yet ridden with us to Detroit Metro Airport, her boyfriend has. "He likes it because he can just hop on and not worry about driving or parking,"

she notes. "I like it because it's nice not having to drive myself, especially at night or during the winter months."

Another benefit: Riding the Flyer helps ease her father's mind: "My dad is really protective of me, so he's happy with the way I'm getting to East Lansing. He worked in IT for Delta Air Lines and often saw the Flyer at the airport in Detroit."

Reminder: Beginning May 7, a REAL ID will be Required to Fly in the U.S.

If you're planning to take a domestic flight in the U.S. on or after May 7, be aware that the Dept. of Homeland Security will then require everyone to have a state-issued Real ID driver's license, U.S. passport or passport card, or other <u>credentials acceptable at TSA Checkpoints</u>

## **Happy Mother's Day!**



In 2025, Mother's Day will be celebrated on Sunday, May 11. Did you know? Celebrations of motherhood go back as far as the ancient Greeks and Romans, and take place in some 40 countries. But the American version only came about because a woman named Anna Jarvis relentlessly championed the cause from 1908 until it became an official U.S. holiday.

Raised in Grafton, W.V., Anna Jarvis moved to Philadelphia with her mother in 1902 after the death of her father, a minister. Her mother—Ann Reeves Jarvis—had been a Sunday school teacher who helped start "Mother's Day Work Clubs" to teach women how to care for their children.

During a lecture in 1876, she had prayed that someone would establish a day to honor mothers for their service to humanity. After her mother's death in 1905, Anna Jarvis vowed to answer that prayer.

She organized the first Mother's Day service at St. Andrew's Methodist Church in Grafton in 1908. Then, with support from her friend John Wanamaker, she helped stage a celebration that drew thousands of people to his Philadelphia department store.

Jarvis then began a years-long, letter-writing campaign, urging politicians to create an annual Mother's Day. She wanted the celebration to be held on the second Sunday of May—the Sunday closest to her mother's death date—and in 1914, Congress and President Woodrow Wilson agreed.

Ironically, Jarvis—the Mother of Mother's Day—never married or had children. In her later years, upset by the commercialization of the holiday, she actually campaigned against it. Even so, virtually everyone loves their mother, which is why more phone calls are made on Mother's Day than any other day of the year.
