"She was my first. We met in 1996, and I fell in love right away. But relationships oscillate. People grow, change, and fly apart sometimes. She's flown away a lot: Atlanta, Canterbury, Jerusalem, and Budapest. So far, she's always come back. Nowadays, she's 700 miles away from me. I can't say hello across the kitchen table anymore or hop in the car for a quick visit, like I'd been able to for the last few years. So, I drive from New Haven to the airport outside of Hartford, and then it's Delta to Detroit and the Flyer west down I-94 to the artsy college town where she seems to fit so well. And I'm glad she fits so well, really, even though she's so far from home. When the bus pulls into the transit center at U-M, I grab my bag and see her waiting—my beautiful, brilliant daughter. Tomorrow I'll be able to say hello to her across the kitchen table, and we'll walk around the town she's calling home. To be honest, I think Ann Arbor has won her over. I don't think she'll be moving back to Connecticut when she finishes her degree. So, we'll have a nice visit, and in a few days, I'll retrace my steps: Michigan Flyer to DTW to Bradley Airport to home. And I'll miss her. But I'm glad she's found her spot in the world, and when I need to, I know how to get back to her."



Meet Danny Nethaway: Jack of All Trades

Danny Nethaway was working for his family's tree service back in 2000. As they were taking trees down on a strip of land owned by Indian Trails near the Owosso, Mich., airport, his brother suggested that Danny consider becoming a bus driver in order to get health care benefits that he didn't have.

That's exactly what Danny did. In the years since signing on with us, he's become a kind of "jack of all trades" at Indian Trails. In his career here, Danny has

served as a driver for both Indian Trails, on regular line runs and charters trips, and for our airport shuttle service, Michigan Flyer, on its route between East Lansing and Detroit Metro Airport.

When he later gave up driving, Danny was offered positions as a dispatcher and head bus washer at our Owosso headquarters.

Unique Experiences

Danny was one of the first drivers for Michigan Flyer when the shuttle service was launched in 2006. "A lot of us thought it was going to be temporary," he recalls. "We had no clue that it would take off the way it did and become so immensely popular."

One of his most memorable trips as a Flyer driver was at the helm of the lead bus to transport members of the University of Michigan's band to former President Gerald Ford's funeral in Grand Rapids. "Ford was a U-M graduate, and we picked up half of the band, which was coming in from out of state, to <u>play at the funeral</u>. My bus actually parked under the wing of Air Force One, so the band got a look inside the plane."

As an Indian Trails driver, Danny had also ferried a variety of groups to destinations like New York, Boston, Philadelphia and Washington, D.C. "It was always nice when those groups requested me again as their driver. I was lucky to meet some really interesting people, too."

Switching Gears

When Danny wanted to change jobs after eight years of driving, Indian Trails offered him a position as a dispatcher, which he did for a year and a half, and also as head bus washer, where he both does the work and trains new crew members. He also pitches in on maintenance. "All of our buses are completely washed every night, the interiors are cleaned and, since Covid, are also thoroughly disinfected," he says. "All three of our garages (in Owosso, Romulus, and Kalamazoo) have stations that look like car washes, except that they're for buses. And if a driver reports a problem with a bus, we do our best to fix it."

The cleaning and maintenance crews take great pride in their work. "These are top-notch motorcoaches, and we want to keep them looking sleek and beautiful," says Danny.

The cleaning crews also turn in anything they find that passengers have unwittingly left behind—like jewelry, cash, and other items—so the company can do its best to return them to their rightful owners. "We know we'd want to get back anything of value that we might misplace."

In his downtime, Danny uses his vocal and guitar talents to entertain veterans at VFW and American Legion halls, as well as nursing homes.

He's grateful that he took his brother's advice more than two decades ago. "There's a real camaraderie here that I enjoy," he says. "I feel like the executives here are doing their best to look after me and my family, so it's up to me to do my best to make sure our buses look terrific and are maintained, so everything runs smoothly, and our customers are happy."

Ann Arbor's Blake Transit Center Bypassed on U-M Football Saturdays

Delta to Expand Flights to China

Beginning on October 29, Delta will expand its flight schedule to China's Shanghai-Pudong International Airport (PVG), operating three-times-weekly service from DTW with an Airbus A350-900 aircraft. Delta passengers flying this route will be able to connect with many other cities in China via the airline's partnership with China Eastern Airlines.

Through the Delta.com website, we found one-way, nonstop, economy fares of \$1,457 for a sample Oct. 20 DTW departure and \$1,579 for a Nov. 10 return from PVG, for a trip total of \$3,036 in airfares (before taxes


Duran Duran - Future Past North American Tour

Airfares for International Autumn Escapes

Our focus this month is on international destinations accessible by nonstop flights—and there aren't many of them. Using Kayak.com we sampled trips originating at Detroit Metro Airport (DTW) on Saturday, Oct. 14, and returning on Wednesday, Oct. 25. Among the criteria used for our spot check: Flights had to be nonstop in both directions, and the return had to arrive at DTW in time for you to catch our last run at 8:15 p.m./8:30 p.m. to Ann Arbor, Brighton, and East Lansing.

You can definitely find lower prices than we did if you're flexible about the dates of travel. If you're also willing to change planes at least once enroute to your destination, then not only will you find lower fares, but the whole world of potential places to visit opens up to you. The following economy **roundtrip** fares include taxes but not necessarily baggage or other "extras":

This time he's on the cover of the August edition of 517 Magazine, a Lansing business and lifestyle journal. We are so proud of his efforts to transport ambulances and critical supplies that make a real difference to the people of this war-torn country.

As we reported in prior issues of our E-News, Ody's personal mission to help ease the suffering of people in Ukraine have inspired hundreds of people, businesses and organizations to get involved. Now having made five trips to the region in a little over a year, he has helped to deliver four fully equipped, trauma-level ambulances, plus a passenger van, to Dnipro, Odesa, and Kiev.

In fact, he's there right now helping to deliver a semitractor trailer full of medical supplies and emergency

equipment to Dnipro.

It has all been made possible by more than \$150,000 in donations so far from a multitude of sources hospitals, Rotary Clubs, fire departments, and legions of ordinary people who just want to help. Happy Labor Day & Welcome Fall!

On Monday, Sept. 4, we celebrate the 129th Labor Day, which honors the enormous contributions of workers to the strength and prosperity of America.

The first labor parade was organized by New York City unions in 1882. More than 10,000 workers marched, though it cost most of them a day's pay. Back then, the average worker toiled for 12 hours a day—seven days a week—just to earn a meager living. In many states, children as young as five worked in mills, factories and mines for even lower wages.

In 1894, Congress established Labor Day as a federal holiday to be celebrated on the first Monday of September. President Grover Cleveland signed it into law. The eight-hour workday was established with passage of the Adamson Act in 1916.

Whether you celebrate Labor Day with a parade, cookout, picnic, fireworks, or long weekend at the

beach, enjoy the rest of summer! Astronomically speaking, the first day of fall arrives on Saturday, Sept. 23—the Autumn Equinox. This is when the Sun crosses the Equator, and those of us in the Northern Hemisphere begin to see more darkness than daylight.
