
"The Air Is Humming, Something Great is Coming" By Isabella Crow

"I'm a student at the University of Michigan. Every trip home, every vacation, every adventure has begun with the Michigan Flyer. I couldn't count the number of times I've taken it. I've watched for it in the Ann Arbor District Library, waiting for the towering bus to round the corner as I played giant chess; I've waited for it in the rain, huddled under the bus shelter, and in the snow, with my face craned towards the clouds. I've walked my suitcase for miles to its doorstep, rattling over cracked concrete and pitted asphalt. I've finagled it onto rental scooters, strapped it to my back on my bike, or arrived with nothing more than the duffel in my hand. I've been so late that I've sprinted to catch it; I've been so early that I picked up coffee and came back with time to spare. I've waited for it before the sun breaks over the parking garage—before the city itself is even awake. Every time I climb onto the Michigan Flyer, I can feel an adventure at its very beginning. Waiting for the bus to pull away from the curb, you can sense that something has started—that the journey is underway. The Michigan Flyer has been the first leg on the way to the beaches of Mexico, to the Northwoods of Michigan, and to the red stone gorges of Kentucky. It's been the texts to my family —"I'm officially on my way home"—and to my grandparents, meeting me for lunch in East Lansing. It's been trips to football games and to the airport, to family and friends. It's never late. It never let me down. It is the gateway and the first step. I board the bus and look out the window, imagining what comes next."

Now You Can Add Your Ticket to Apple or Google Wallet!

When you buy a Michigan Flyer ticket online, you can now add an e-ticket to the digital wallet on your Apple or Google smartphone, making it easier for you to board our buses. It's simple: At checkout, when buying your ticket, just tap "Add to Wallet." After that, there's no need for you to print out a paper boarding pass, or rummage through emails to find your confirmed reservation. Fewer Michigan Flyer Runs on Christmas Eve

While our office will be closed on Christmas Eve and Christmas Day, we will operate some—but not all—of our runs on Tuesday, Dec. 24. Moreover, on Wednesday, Dec. 25, as well as on New Year's Eve and New Year's Day, we plan to operate our full daily schedule of 12 roundtrips. Delta to Resume Flights to Bahamas on Dec. 21



If you're eager to get away for an island vacation, you may be happy to know that Delta Air Lines is now offering nonstop flights between Detroit Metro Airport (DTW) and Lynden Pindling International Airport (NAS) in Nassau, Bahamas. The seasonal route, which is resuming after a four-year pause, runs once weekly on Saturdays through April 12, 2025. You can book roundtrips through Delta's website starting at \$757 for basic economy class seats.

Avelo Airlines to Add Low-Cost Detroit-New Haven Flights in April

U.S.-based budget airline <u>Avelo</u> is set to launch nonstop flights between Detroit Metro Airport (DTW) and Connecticut's Tweed-New Haven Airport (HVN) twice weekly beginning April 4. We spot-checked prices for a roundtrip departing DTW on Friday, April 4, and returning on Friday, April 11, and found ample economy-class seating available for \$64.

Holiday Downtimes for D2A2 Express Bus

The D2A2 Express Bus between Detroit and Ann Arbor will not operate during the Christmas and New Year holidays (Dec. 24, 25, 31, and Jan. 1). On normal weekdays, the luxury motorcoaches of D2A2 offer 16 eco-friendly roundtrips between Detroit's Grand Circus Park (1508 Park Ave.) and Ann Arbor's Blake Transit Center (328 S. Fifth St.), plus eight roundtrips on weekends. See the schedule here. The D2A2 is a service of the Regional Transit Authority of Southeast Michigan and is operated by Michigan Flyer.

The Wonderland is open from 5 p.m. to 8 p.m. Thursday, Friday, Saturday and Sunday between now and Monday, Dec. 23. Step into a real-life winter wonderland as thousands of sparkling lights transform the zoo into a magical holiday paradise. Wander through festively illuminated pathways while listening to holiday music as you take in dazzling displays. Visit Santa for photos that capture cherished family memories (Friday and Saturday only). <u>Tickets \$5-\$9 per person</u>.

NOTE: A Capital Area Transportation Authority bus can get you from East Lansing to the Potter Park in about 45 minutes for \$1.25. Near the corner of westbound Grand River Ave. and M.A.C. (a short walk from our location at the East Lansing Marriott), catch CATA's #1 bus to downtown Lansing. At Grand Ave., use a free transfer card to switch to the #8 bus heading south toward Holt. Get off at S. Pennsylvania Ave. and Fletcher St., then walk about 10 minutes to the zoo. See CATA's Trip Planner here.

<u>Island Lake Lantern</u> <u>Hike</u>

Enjoy the winter wonderland of the Hickory Ridge hiking trail during the Island Lake Lantern Hike. This self-guided loop hike spans 1.5 miles, and is completely lit by lanterns. Hikers can start any time between 6:00 and 9:00 p.m., after which the lights are taken down.

This fun outdoor event takes place at Island Lake Recreation Area, 6301 Kensington Rd., in Brighton. While admission is FREE, a Michigan Recreation Passport is required for entry. Note, too, that Island Lake is about a 10-minute drive or 2½ hour hike from Michigan Flyer's location at the Brighton Meijer store.

Airfares to Warm, Romantic Places for Valentine's Day



Using <u>SkyScanner.com</u>, we set out to scout prices for a sample trip that includes Valentine's Day. We chose Wednesday, Feb. 12, for the departure from DTW, and Wednesday, Feb. 19, for the return. As usual, our search criteria required that the flights be non-stop in both directions, and had to arrive back at DTW in time for you to catch Michigan Flyer's last run at 9:45/10 p.m. to Ann Arbor, Brighton, and East Lansing.
