

Meet Your Driver, Mark Sturtz

Before he began driving for Indian Trails, Mark Sturtz worked as a photographer for a portrait studio for 25 years, and then as a school bus driver for the Kearsley Community School District in Genesee County, Mich.



Then, almost a decade ago, the Flint native heard about Indian Trails. "My friend said they were hiring drivers and I should check it out. I'm so glad I did."

Mark joined Indian Trails in 2014 after passing its sixweek training program for new drivers, which includes learning the rules and regulations for motor carriers, maneuvering a motorcoach, the mechanics of the bus, safe driving techniques, passenger safety, customer service, company history, and more. Previous experience as a school bus driver was helpful, but with his particular learning style, Mark found some aspects of the training challenging. "The trainers worked with me, at my pace, so I could master it all. And afterward,

they continued to be very accommodating. Veteran drivers were also generous with their advice."

Moving to Michigan Flyer

Initially, Mark drove regular daily routes for Indian Trails but when an opportunity arose for him to become a full-time Michigan Flyer driver in 2021, he leapt at it. "This worked well," he says. "It's a really good fit for where my life is right now."

Mark says his aim every time he gets behind the wheel is to provide passengers with a smooth, efficient, and customer-friendly trip to their destination. "Our #1 goal is always passenger safety," he says, while also giving high marks to the mechanics who keep our motorcoaches in tip-top shape. "I love our mechanics and the fact that it doesn't matter which bus I get when I arrive on duty since they all operate so well."

Avoiding Delays

Every driver knows that an accident or unforeseen roadwork can delay travel. And for our passengers, that can result in missing a flight or another important connection. So Mark appreciates that our staff constantly monitors what's happening on our route between East Lansing, Brighton, Ann Arbor, and Detroit Metro Airport.

"The staff is so good at feeding new directions to drivers, as needed, in order to re-route us to our destinations efficiently," says Mark. "It's all about doing everything we can to deliver great customer service."



"Most passengers are happy to be on my bus, and I get a lot of thank-yous," he notes, "especially from folks experiencing Michigan Flyer for the first time. They're impressed with the comfort and amenities of our coaches."

When he's not at work, Mark relaxes with an old job that's now a hobby. "I still love photography and the outdoors, so now I mostly take pictures of birds. I've even set up a wireless remote photo system in my backyard to capture different birds who come to rest on a perch."

Travel Alerts

Overcoming Disruption of the National Bus Network

If you're among the many thousands of people who love to travel across America on luxury motorcoaches—like



✓ those operated by our parent company, Indian Trails

—you may find it difficult to buy tickets online or from ticket agents after February 21.


As you may know, Indian Trails connects or "interlines" with almost 80 other bus companies across the country. So, up to now, you've been able to buy one ticket that includes travel on two or more carriers in the national transportation network. Effective February 22, this no longer includes Greyhound.

The current situation—only temporary—is due to a decision by Greyhound/FlixBus to terminate all existing

interline agreements and discontinue its interline ticketing system (TRIPS) for all U.S. carriers effective February 22. (Greyhound was acquired by Flix SE, a German firm, in October 2021.) As a result, Indian Trails is ending its nearly 100-year interlining arrangement with Greyhound.

In place of the old TRIPS ticketing system, a new, independent national interline ticketing system is being launched on February 22. It offers much more flexibility for customers and carriers, plus an even larger network of carriers for intercity bus travelers.

Where's My Bus?

For passengers boarding in Ann Arbor, the answer is available on an electronic sign INSIDE the bus shelter by the Blake Transit Center. It continuously displays updated arrival times for both Michigan Flyer and D2A2 buses. The data beamed to the sign by WiFi comes from satellite-based GPS systems and computers on board each of our motorcoaches, which monitor bus location and speed. (Note that the same data is used by our free app for both Apple and Android smartphone—the Indian Trails Bus Tracker—which is available to all passengers.) Next, we'll be rolling out electronic signs at our locations in East Lansing and Brighton.

Book Seats NOW for Spring Break

Friendly reminder: Michigan Flyer-AirRide seats will likely sell out for the spring break period from Feb. 24 to March 12. That's when many of tens of thousands of

students, faculty and staff members at Michigan State University and the University of Michigan will be traveling to and from Detroit Metro Airport (DTW). For U-M, spring break is from Saturday, Feb. 25, to Monday, March 6; for MSU, it's from Monday, March 6, through Friday, March 10. So, reserve your seats early if you're planning on riding with us to DTW and back during this period.

Airfares for Spring Getaways

Ready for vacation in warmer weather? Using Skyscanner.com, we spot-checked prices for roundtrip travel



between DTW and a variety of sunny destinations departing on Friday, April 7, and returning on Sunday, April 16. Among our search criteria: Flights had to be non-stop in both directions, and the return had to arrive at DTW in time for passengers to catch our last run at 8:15 p.m./8:30 p.m. to Ann Arbor, Brighton, and East Lansing.

NOTE: Most airfares have increased since our last spot check a month ago. But lower prices than these are readily available for anyone flexible about the dates of travel, or willing to change planes en route to their destination. In fact, if you're okay with making one stop

along the way, instead of taking a direct flight, then a world of potential destinations is open to you. Our sample economy roundtrip fares include taxes but not necessarily baggage or other "extras."

University, East Lansing. Tickets \$19-\$47 plus \$2.50-\$5 fee.




✓ So This is Love ... A Cabaret Matinee to Benefit Ukraine

All Things Equal: The Life and Trials of Ruth Bader Ginsburg



Happy St. Patrick's Day, Springtime, Passover & Easter!

Daylight Savings Time. In every state except Arizona and Hawaii (which opted out of the time change), DST will start on Sunday, March 12, in 2023. That's when clocks "spring forward"—or skip—one hour, so there's more daylight to enjoy in the evening, though less in the morning.

St. Patrick's Day, on March 17, is the cultural and religious celebration of Ireland's patron saint, who died in the year 461 A.D. Parades, shamrocks, green clothing and beer are featured in many countries worldwide. Little-known fact: Although he converted the pagan Irish to Christianity, he wasn't Irish himself, but rather Romano-British.

Spring. Shortly after DST begins, spring officially arrives in the Northern Hemisphere on Monday, March 20 the "vernal equinox"—when the Sun is directly above the Earth's equator, and day and night are both 12 hours



long. The weather warms and flowers bloom. However, in the Southern Hemisphere, this is the beginning of autumn.

Passover, which lasts from sundown on Wednesday, April 5, to sundown on Thursday, April 13, in 2023, is the major Jewish celebration marking the Exodus of the Children of Israel from slavery in ancient Egypt. The first night often involves great ceremony around a special family meal called the seder, where foods such as matzo—symbolic of liberation—are eaten, and traditional recitations are performed.

Easter is on Sunday, April 9, this year. The Christian feast day and holiday—famous for brightly-colored

eggs, bonnets, bunnies, candy baskets, lilies, and church services—commemorates the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead. That occurred three days after his crucifixion by the Romans at Calvary in 30 A.D., according to the Bible's New Testament.
