# **Meet Michigan Flyer Driver Gary Woods**

After years of living out of state, and traveling to different parts of the world, Gary Woods headed home to Michigan in hopes of finding a job that suited him.

One day, driving in downtown Owosso, he passed by the Indian Trails headquarters. That brought back fond memories of motorcoach trips he'd taken as a youth to places like Florida and Cedar Point. Suddenly, Gary was struck by the idea that he might want to become a driver.

"I started with Indian Trails in March 2019 and it's been a perfect fit," he says. "In fact, I enjoy it so much that I suggested to my brother that he might like it, too."

Shortly afterward his brother, Brent Bentler, also became an Indian Trails driver. And then Gary talked their cousin Bo Slomkowski into joining our driver training program. Bo has just passed the course for his

commercial driver's license and will be hitting the road soon. "Professional bus driving is a perfect fit for both of them, too," says Gary.

Born in Flint and raised in Byron, Mich., Gary has lived in Canada, New Jersey, Nebraska, Colorado, and Ohio, mostly working as a pastoral minister. Part of his job at the Creation Museum in Petersburg, Ky., was to transport folks from the parking lot to the museum in a shuttle bus.

"I found I really liked the passengers and the variety of people I met every day," he says, adding that, when he later applied for a driver's position at Indian Trails, he thought, "Why not get paid to do something I enjoy most —traveling and sightseeing?"

Once he passed our rigorous driver training program, Gary started piloting group charter trips. That fulfilled two of his passions: Seeing new places, and adding to the enjoyment of his passengers.

"I've been to so many places, including Washington D.C., Toronto, Niagara Falls, Chicago, and throughout northern Michigan," he says. "It's great."

#### Switching to the Flyer

Gary began driving for Michigan Flyer, a subsidiary of Indian Trails, in 2021. Besides the travelers he meets, he enjoys his coworkers and the variety: "It feels new every day—not like a 9 to 5 job."

In his current assignment since November, he's up before dawn to start the Flyer's daily runs at 2 a.m., always striving to give his passengers a smooth ride. And it's often so smooth that he has to wake up some when they reach Detroit Metro Airport: "Most say, 'I can't believe we're here already."

When he's not driving, Gary enjoys woodworking. He's also eagerly anticipating his June wedding in the Philippines, where he met his fiancée, Jolina.

Gary is a recipient of the Cora V. Taylor Safe Driving Award, which is presented annually by Indian Trails to drivers who complete an entire year without a preventable accident.

## Announcing New Low-Cost Flights at Detroit Metro Airport

Frontier Airlines has announced the "massive" addition of flights at 38 airports nationwide and internationally—including DTW—with fares as low as \$19 one way from April into June. Specifically, Frontier will offer new nonstop flights between Detroit and Baltimore-Washington International Airport (BWI) four times a week beginning April 10. Then on April 22, it plans to launch new nonstop service between DTW and Dallas-

Note that the \$19 fares are available only to Frontier's "Discount Den" members who pay \$59.99 annually plus a \$40 enrollment fee. But even without signing up, the airline's standard fares are quite low. For example, when we recently checked, a roundtrip between DTW and BWI departing on Saturday, May 25, and returning on Saturday, June 1, cost just \$87. If you're planning a spring trip, please remember that it's a peak demand period for Michigan Flyer because students at Michigan State University and the University of Michigan are traveling, too. ## Most Michigan Flyer Fares Will Rise Slightly in May

Just as our riders have experienced significant inflation in the cost of gas, groceries, and housing prices over the past few years, we've been coping with increased operating expenses, too. And we haven't raised prices for years—since well before the COVID-19 pandemic. So, as of May 13, most of our fares are going up a notch—but only by \$1 or \$2 per person one-way. For example, tickets for travel from East Lansing to Brighton or Ann Arbor will go from \$15 to \$16, and tickets to DTW will go from \$32 to \$34. You can view all of our new fares online here.

Frequent riders from East Lansing to Ann Arbor or to DTW may want to check out the Discounts section of the Fares sheet, where you'll find that prices are staying the same for our money-saving Commuter Travel Passes.

## ■ Buyer Beware: Does Your Travel Insurance Offer Real Protection?

The coverage offered by trip cancellation, delay and interruption policies varies widely depending on the "perils" or "hazards" listed in the fine print, as well as by how the insurer will reimburse for any loss. For example, some cruise package policies will not reimburse you at all if a delay by a "common carrier" such as an airline causes you to miss the boat. Others won't pay cash, but instead only give partial credit for use on a future trip. This New York Times column describes one woman's lengthy struggle to collect even the 75 percent credit for a costly cruise she missed, despite the fact that her policy had a "cancel for any reason" clause.

### Dionne Warwick

A six-time Grammy Award-winning music legend who has recorded more than 75 hit songs and sold over 100 million records, Dionne Warwick was discovered by Burt Bacharach and Hal David in 1961, and went on to record 18 consecutive Top 100 singles ("Don't Make Me Over," Walk on By," "Say a Little Prayer," "A House is Not a Home," "Alfie," "Heartbreaker," and "Déjà Vu," among others). She received her first Grammy in 1968 for "Do You Know the Way to San Jose?" ## **Airfares for Summer Getaways**

The sooner you start planning your summer escape, the less expensive your airline tickets are apt to be. We scouted nonstop roundtrips to popular destinations using <a href="Skyscanner.com">Skyscanner.com</a>, spot-checking fares for flights originating at DTW on the sample date of Friday, June 21, and returning on Saturday, June 29. Among the search criteria we used: Flights had to be nonstop and direct to the destination both ways, and the return flight had to arrive at DTW in time for you to catch our last run at 9:45 or 10 p.m. to Ann Arbor, Brighton and East Lansing.

Even so, please be advised that you can easily find lower prices than shown here—as well as a greater selection of destinations—if you're willing to change planes

enroute. Being flexible about the dates on which you travel can also mean big savings on airfares. Note that these economy roundtrip fares include taxes, but not necessarily baggage or other "extras":

# **Update on Our Humanitarian Mission to Ukraine**

The enormous volunteer effort originally sparked by Michigan Flyer VP Ody Norkin in 2022 recently succeeded in delivering a brand new Digital X-Ray machine to Dnipro Municipal Hospital in Ukraine. It is now in full operation by the medical staff, making a huge difference in the treatment of military and civilian war victims.

As you may recall from our prior E-News reports of <u>May</u>, <u>June</u>, and <u>December</u> 2022, this humanitarian mission began with Ody's personal determination to buy a desperately needed ambulance to transport elderly and infirm refugees out of harm's way.

Yet, as word spread, hundreds of generous people, businesses, health systems and other nonprofit organizations—locally, as well as overseas—began contributing. This includes the 15 Rotary Clubs of Michigan's District 6360; the Rotary Clubs in Suceava, Romania, and Dnipro, Ukraine; the East Lansing Rotary Foundation; the Block Imaging Corporation and Block family of Holt, Mich.; the Greater Lansing Jewish Federation; The Peoples Church of East Lansing; Kiwanis Club of East Lansing; International Association of Torch Clubs of East Lansing, and many more.





As a result, four trauma-ready ambulances have been delivered to war-torn Ukraine, along with a transit van and whole shipping container full of medical supplies.

Now, fundraising is focused on delivering a \$60,000 Computerized Tomography (CT) scanner to the Dnipro Hospital, where it is urgently needed to support the trauma surgery unit.

"On behalf of the entire volunteer team, I'd like to extend our heartful gratitude to every donor," says Ody. "We deeply appreciate any financial contribution toward this critical mission." # Happy St. Patrick's Day, Springtime, Easter & Passover!

Daylight Savings Time. In every state except Arizona and Hawaii (which opted out of the time change), DST will start on Sunday, March 10, in 2024. That's when clocks "spring forward"—or skip one hour—so there's more daylight to enjoy in the evening, though less in the morning.

St. Patrick's Day, on Sunday, March 17, is the celebration of Ireland's patron saint, who died in the year 461 A.D. Parades, shamrocks, green clothing and beer are featured in many countries worldwide. Fun

fact: Although he converted the pagan Irish to Christianity, he wasn't Irish himself, but rather Romano-British.

Spring. Shortly after DST begins, spring officially arrives in the Northern Hemisphere on Tuesday, March 19 the "vernal equinox"—when the Sun is directly above the Earth's equator, and day and night are both 12 hours long. The weather warms and flowers bloom. In the Southern Hemisphere, though, this marks the start of autumn.

Easter is on Sunday, March 31, this year. The Christian feast day and holiday—famous for brightly-colored eggs, bonnets, bunnies, candy baskets, lilies, and church services—commemorates the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead. That occurred three days after his crucifixion by the Romans at Calvary in 30 A.D., according to the Bible's New Testament.

Passover, which lasts from sundown on Monday, April 22, to sundown on Tuesday, April 30, in 2024, is the major Jewish celebration marking the Exodus of the Children of Israel from slavery in ancient Egypt. The first night often involves great ceremony around a special family meal called the seder, where foods such as matzo —symbolic of liberation—are eaten, and traditional recitations are performed.
