

Meet Your Driver, Keith Lockwood



Keith Lockwood was working for a restoration company, removing water from flooded homes and businesses, when an ad caught his eye for bus drivers at Indian Trails, our parent company.

"I'd been a pipefitter, a welder for 20 years, and was doing restoration work when I thought it might be time to try something different," he recalls.

"It really surprised some friends and family when I told them I was applying. "They said, 'But you don't like driving!' Well, I didn't love it when I was a welder and had to drive all over, but this is different and so much better."

Just over two years later, Keith is happy he made the career change. Starting out as all Indian Trails drivers do, he passed a weeks-long intensive training program before going on his first regular run to St. Ignace, Mich.

A native of Zilwaukee, Mich., who grew up in Bay City (and lives there today), Keith hadn't heard of Indian Trails before he saw that ad. In training, he was both surprised and impressed to learn that the company has been around since 1910. He appreciates its longevity, and the corporate values that have been passed down for 115 years: "They really do treat you like family."

Also, he's grateful to then-Safety & Training Manager Becky Smith, who spotted Keith still taking copious notes well into his training. "Even after learning so much, I was worried about forgetting stuff. But she took my notebook away." She knew he was using it as a crutch, when Keith was nearly ready to walk on his own. "I calmed way down after that," he says.

Like most new drivers at Indian Trails, Keith was nervous when it came time to drive an entire route on his own. "In training, we take our first trips with veteran drivers," he says. "So, it's a bit intimidating when you finally go solo, but also a relief when that drive is under your belt."



Moving to the Flyer

When the chance came to operate for Michigan Flyer over a year ago, Keith was excited. "I'd filled in as a substitute driver for the Flyer and was looking for a set schedule. It's been great."

Among the things Keith most appreciates about it are his passengers, the feeling of independence when he's behind the wheel, and the fact that—while his route is always the same—each day is different. "You never know what you're going to see and what

to expect. Like the time two tires came rolling across the road from a semi-truck—that was a first! I saw it happening and pulled over safely as I was trained to do."

First and foremost for Keith, as for all our drivers, is passenger safety, plus getting them to their destinations on time.

"I've met a lot of interesting folks on this job," he says. "I always aim to do my best to assist my passengers and give them a safe and smooth ride." After hours, spending time with his grandchildren is at the top of Keith's list. He also enjoys hunting.

Spring break for both MSU and U-M students runs from Sunday, March 2, through Sunday, March 9, this year. REAL ID Required for All U.S. Flights as of May 7, 2025

If you're planning to take a domestic flight in the U.S. on or after May 7, be aware that the Dept. of Homeland Security will require everyone to have a state-issued **REAL ID** driver's license, U.S. passport or passport card, or other credentials acceptable at TSA Checkpoints.

Travelers who buy plane tickets but cannot show a REAL ID-compliant license or acceptable alternative beginning May 7, 2025 will not be permitted through the security checkpoint. REAL ID drivers licenses have a star and/or flag imprinted on them or say "Enhanced." Click for more info, including sample REAL ID licenses by state.

These are the Longest Flights from DTW

Have you ever wondered how far you can fly from Detroit Metro Airport without changing planes—and how long the flights would take? If so, here are some answers to satisfy curious minds.

The 10 longest nonstop flights from Detroit Metro Airport range from 3,766 miles over 7½ hours for London, England, to roughly double those figures for Shanghai, China. More on VP Ody Norkin's Mission to Ease Pain in Ukraine

Michigan Flyer VP Ody Norkin is currently engaged in his fifth humanitarian project for Ukraine. This time, he's helping to procure and deliver an arthroscopic surgical tower to the municipal hospital in Dnipro. He's also shipping three suitcases full of woundand burn-care supplies.

The East Lansing Rotary Club Foundation and Jewish Federation of Greater Lansing combined forces to purchase the refurbished machine and tools for \$48,000, which Ody notes was "a really good deal since a new scope costs over \$200,000." His cousin, surgeon Michael Holzman of Vanderbilt Medical Center in Nashville, TN, tapped his extensive healthcare connections to find just the right machine at A.A. Medical in Mokena, Ill. Then it was shipped along with six boxes of parts from New Jersey to the Dnipro Ukraine Rotary Club.

Ody's charitable mission, begun in 2022, has inspired an enormous volunteer response involving hundreds of people, businesses, health systems, and nonprofit organizations—from across the U.S. and around the globe—to pitch in.

So far, the effort has delivered to wartorn Ukraine four trauma-ready ambulances plus a transit van to transport elderly and infirm refugees out of harm's way; an entire shipping container full of medical supplies; and a digital x-ray machine. 
"We deeply appreciate every contribution toward this critical mission," says Ody. "Even small amounts have added up to make a big difference in easing the pain and suffering."

Whether you're a parent whose child would delight in true tales of dinosaurs, or an adult who'd love to learn more about the secrets of the cosmos, Abrams Planetarium has you covered. During March, it's presenting programs on both subjects.

Dinosaurs—showing each Sunday at 2:30 p.m.—tells the story of Celeste, who's preparing a talk for her class about how the creatures went extinct, when a magical character named Moon asks if there are still dinosaurs among us. So begins an exciting journey to Earth's distant past where giant beasts and super predators roam until a cataclysmic event causes their disappearance. But never fear, Celeste also discovers the key to their survival.

The Dark Matter Mystery—each Friday and Saturday in March at 8 p.m., and Sunday at 4 p.m.— takes you on the biggest quest of contemporary astrophysics. What keeps galaxies together? What are the building blocks of the universe? Researchers worldwide are trying to answer these questions. We already know that approximately

one-fourth of the Universe is filled with a mysterious glue: Dark Matter. But we have no idea what it is made of. In this show, you'll join scientists on their hunt for Dark Matter with experiments in space and deep underground.

Each show is approximately an hour long. <u>Tickets at the door are \$5.50 for adults, \$5 for seniors, and \$4.50 for children 12 or under</u>. Additional fees may apply to online orders. Abrams Planetarium is located at 755 Science Rd. on the MSU campus in East Lansing. That's about a <u>one mile or 20-minute walk</u> from Michigan Flyer's headquarters at the East Lansing Marriott.

directed by Denyse Clayton.





The sooner you start planning your summer escape, the less expensive your airline tickets are apt to be. We scouted nonstop roundtrips to popular destinations using Skyscanner.com, spot-checking fares for flights originating at DTW on the sample date of Friday, June 20, and returning on Saturday, June 28. Among the search criteria we used: Flights had to be nonstop to the destination both ways, and the return flight had to arrive at DTW in time for you to catch our last run at 9:45 or 10 p.m. to Ann Arbor, Brighton and East Lansing.

You can easily find lower prices than these if you're flexible about the dates on which you travel, and/or willing to change planes enroute. For the best prices, too, be sure to buy tickets at least three weeks before your trip. Note that these economy roundtrip fares include taxes, but not necessarily baggage or other "extras":

Welcome DST, Springtime & St. Patrick's Day!



Daylight Savings Time. In every state except Arizona and Hawaii (which opted out of the time change), DST will start on Sunday, March 9, in 2025. That's when clocks "spring forward"—or skip one hour —so there's more daylight to enjoy in the evening, though less in the morning.

St. Patrick's Day, on Monday, March 17, is the cultural and religious celebration of Ireland's patron saint, who died in the year 461 A.D. Parades, shamrocks, green clothing and beer are featured in many countries worldwide. Little-known fact: Although he converted the pagan Irish to Christianity, he wasn't Irish himself, but rather Romano-British.

Spring officially arrives in the Northern Hemisphere on Thursday, March 20—the "vernal equinox"—when the Sun is directly above the Earth's equator, and day and night are both 12 hours long. The weather warms and flowers bloom. However, in the Southern Hemisphere, this is the beginning of autumn.
