Travel Alert Book Seats Now for Spring Break "Perfect Storm"

Consider this fair warning if you're planning to travel with us in early March. Michigan Flyer-AirRide seats will almost certainly be sold out for the **March 2-March 10 spring break period** for students at Michigan State University and the University of Michigan.

Usually, spring break at MSU is not scheduled for exactly the same time as at U-M, yet it's still a bit of a

stretch for us to accommodate everyone who'd like a ride to Detroit Metro Airport and back. But this year is different—a kind of "perfect storm" when most of the combined 96,400 students from the East Lansing and Ann Arbor campuses will be traveling all at once, along with many of their 42,400 faculty and staff members. So, word to the wise: Reserve your seats with us ASAP.

Spring Break Airfares

Using Skyscanner.com and Kayak.com, we spot-checked prices for the cheapest roundtrips originating at DTW on March 2 and returning on March 10. Among the search criteria we used: Roundtrips had to be non-stop in both directions, and the return flight had to arrive at DTW in time for you to catch our last Sunday run at 10:15 p.m./10:30 p.m. to Ann Arbor and East Lansing. You may well be able to find lower prices if you're flexible

Kamau Omari at Your Service

As a specialist with the U.S. Army National Guard, Kamau Omari knows the importance of working together as a team with his fellow soldiers to achieve a goal. That's what also makes him a natural fit as one of our newest customer service representatives at Detroit Metropolitan Airport (DTW), helping to keep things on track so our motorcoaches stay on schedule.

A Detroit native, Kamau is closing in on his third year of a six-year contract with the National Guard. He joined out of a sense of patriotism and desire to be part of the

military. "It's a great mission to be a public servant," he says.

Kamau first heard about the position from his longtime friend, Aundraj Franklin, who is also a customer service rep (and was profiled in <u>last month's *E-News*</u>). The two were high school classmates and members of the Junior ROTC. They're still involved with that program through the Detroit Public School District.

Kamau and Aundraj joined Jason Balk, who's been with the Flyer since 2015, as staffers trained to help passengers check in, find their way to the right motorcoach, load/unload bags, and work with our drivers to ensure the best possible travel experience for you.

Besides the flexibility of the job, Kamau appreciates the faith that Michigan Flyer management has in its reps to do their jobs well with minimal supervision. At the same time, he's impressed when Flyer VP Ody Norkin and Office Manager Diane Moore come to DTW from East Lansing to help out during peak travel periods.

"You don't have to clock in or out," he says. "They expect us to have the integrity to show up and do our jobs to the best of our ability, and we do."

While Kamau had not heard of Michigan Flyer before starting the job, he was familiar with our parent company, Indian Trails. "I rode their charters when I was with the Junior ROTC heading up to Alpena and the training center there," he said. "I've also ridden them with the Guard, traveling to and from Camp Grayling."

Working for the Flyer, he's learned firsthand what an important, cost-effective service it is for people who want to leave their cars behind when going to DTW. "It's a great service and the buses are so modern and comfortable." Kamau also enjoys working with our drivers and passengers.

"It's always interesting to meet people from all over," he says. "I remember talking with a young woman from England who wouldn't drive in Michigan because folks don't always use their turn signals or stay within the posted speed limits."

Kamau appreciates, too, his military training on the rare occasions when a passenger gets upset about a cancelled flight or the inability to board an earlier bus. "I do my best to assess the problem and diffuse the situation," he says.

On the flip side, he finds it gratifying when a passenger can catch an earlier bus when his or her flight arrives earlier than expected, or when a Flyer motorcoach is available after a flight to Lansing has been cancelled.

"Naturally, they're all smiles and relieved when they hear they can get home."
