Michigan Flyer to Operate Detroit-DTW Express Bus Service

The <u>Regional Transit Authority of Southeast Michigan</u> (RTA)—in partnership with Michigan Flyer and its parent company, <u>Indian Trails</u>, <u>Inc.</u>—is launching an express bus pilot program to connect Downtown Detroit with Detroit Metro Airport (DTW).

The new express bus service will operate up to 16 roundtrips each day between approximately 3:30 a.m.

and 11 p.m.—mostly traveling on I-94—starting as early as the end of March. A one-way trip is expected to take about 30 minutes, and cost up to \$15 per passenger, though discounts will be available.

The pick-up and drop-off location in downtown Detroit could be near Washington Boulevard and State Street, or at Park Avenue and Bagley Street, next to Grand Circus Park.

At the airport, the new express buses will serve both the McNamara and Evans Terminals. Among other benefits, this will enable Michigan Flyer passengers from the East Lansing, Brighton, and Ann Arbor areas to easily connect with downtown Detroit from the airport.

"We are excited about the proposed Detroit to Airport Express Service pilot and the benefits it will provide our community," said Ben Stupka, executive director of the RTA. "This service will give tourists, visitors and people working at DTW an additional transit option to choose from when traveling between the airport and downtown Detroit."

Chad Cushman, president of Indian Trails, said, "We're also excited to once again partner with the RTA on a new airport service between Detroit and DTW. Riders can expect the same high quality of service we've been providing to date with the D2A2 and Michigan Flyer-AirRide services."

D2A2 is an express bus service connecting downtown Detroit and downtown Ann Arbor. Michigan Flyer-AirRide (as most E-News readers know) makes frequent daily roundtrips between East Lansing, Brighton, Ann Arbor, and DTW.

The RTA secured a \$2.5 million federal grant to fund at least one year of the new service, which will operate as a pilot project to help determine demand and possible future expansion. The funding comes from the Federal Highway Administration's Carbon Reduction Program, administered by the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments and distributed through the Federal Transit Administration.



Meet Keith Cork, Michigan Flyer's New General Manager

There's a fresh face among our Michigan Flyer staff. Keith "Casey" Cork started his new position this week as our general manager. He joins the Flyer team that includes Vice President Ody Norkin, office manager Diane Moore, and Rachel Norkin.

A native of Sault Ste Marie, Mich., Casey served for 20 years as both an Indian Trails and Greyhound Bus ticket agent in the mid-Michigan market. Indian Trails is the parent company of Michigan Flyer.

"Casey brings decades of intercity bus experience to the Flyer," says Indian Trails President Chad Cushman. "That, combined with his expertise in new forms of technology, will bring a valuable perspective to our evergrowing Michigan Flyer business."

Before starting in the transportation business in 2003, Casey had been contemplating switching colleges from Lake Superior State University to Michigan State University, with potential majors ranging from engineering to business. Then his life took a detour.

"I started a job as a ticket agent working with Indian Trails and Greyhound and just kept the ball rolling," he says, adding that he worked in a ticketing call center for Flint, Pontiac, and Detroit.

Customer Service—Just the Ticket

Casey says he's excited to be part of the company's commitment to providing great customer service: "I knew nothing about intercity transportation when I started. I found I love the customer service aspect and dealing with multiple ethnicities and people from around the globe."

When Casey, who lives in Grand Ledge, Mich., started ticketing directly for Indian Trails in 2015, he was impressed with both the company's history (founded in 1910) and its reputation for quality in management, staff, and services.

And that includes the Michigan Flyer, launched in 2006. "The Flyer is a high-quality service that filled a great need in this area. People depend on it and that includes me, my family, and friends. There's also a wonderful staff here."

His Role at the Flyer

As general manager, Casey's duties include administration, ticket sales, customer service, and pitching in to ensure everything stays on schedule. "The Flyer has an on-time accuracy of about 98 percent and I think nearly anyone who experiences the safety, comfort and cost-effectiveness of the Flyer for the first time is ready to ride with us again."

Casey, who uses the Flyer to head to Detroit Metro and to his favorite vacation spots south of the border, says his top goal is to "make sure our customers get to where they're going on time and with a smile on their face. I want to continue the legacy that's long been established here. If we find new and innovative ways to improve on that, then we can make it even better."



Travel Alerts

The Michigan Flyer office at the East Lansing Marriott is now staffed from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday. On Saturdays and Sundays, there is no inperson service at the office. Still, not to worry.

Passengers can buy tickets 24/7 through our website at www.MichiganFlyer.com. And while tickets are non-refundable once purchased, two changes per

reservation are allowed before a scheduled departure. You can easily change reservations online here.

Reminder #2: No More Discount Parking in Ann Arbor

If you're a Michigan Flyer-AirRide passenger who liked parking a car in the structure at the corner of 4th Ave. and William St. downtown, then you should know that the discount parking rate of **\$2 per day** has been discontinued. While you can still park there, the rate is **\$1.20 per hour** Monday through Saturday. The Ann Arbor Downtown Development Authority (DDA), which manages the structure for the city, no longer offers discount parking rates for our passengers. PLEASE NOTE: Michigan Flyer's Lansing-area passengers still enjoy discounted, covered parking at the rate of \$2.50 a day on the fourth floor of the ramp across from the East Lansing Marriott—perfect for avoiding winter weather while getting to or from your bus.

Our "Hytch" Door-to-Door Service Ends on Feb. 9

Up until Feb. 9, Michigan Flyer passengers can still reserve a Hytch-branded minivan to connect with their bus at the East Lansing Marriott, right from—or to—the door of their home, workplace, or another location in the Hytch service area. After that, the Hytch pilot project will be temporarily suspended until or unless future funding can be obtained.

✓ Plan Ahead for Flight Delays and Cancellations

Winter storms, Arctic cold, and the <u>grounding of Boeing 737 Max 9</u> airplanes have together led to the ongoing disruption of thousands of flights nationwide—including hundreds at DTW. To minimize the chances of a flight delay or cancellation spoiling your travel plans, consider booking an earlier departure than usual, as well as taking an earlier Michigan Flyer motorcoach to or from the airport. Also, remember that you can <u>change your</u> Flyer reservations online.

Book NOW for Travel in Late February & Early March!

If you're planning a spring break trip, please remember that it's a peak demand period for Michigan Flyer

because students at Michigan State University and the University of Michigan are traveling, too. Spring break for both MSU and U-M students runs from Feb. 26 to March 1 this year. So, we're expecting sold-out buses between Feb. 22 and March 4. To guarantee that we have a seat for you, make reservations without delay at MichiganFlyer.com.

More on Ody's Mission to Ease Pain in Ukraine

Michigan Flyer VP Ody Norkin is heading back to Eastern Europe this month to continue his humanitarian mission. This time around, he'll be going to Bucharest to await what he calls "our most significant contribution to Ukraine to date," a digital X-ray machine from Block Imaging Company of Holt, Mich., at Bucharest air cargo. "Though this involves a significant logistical challenge," he says, "this X-ray unit will be a game changer for the hospital in Dnipro, Ukraine."

When Russia began its brutal invasion of Ukraine in

February 2022, Ody was appalled, as you may recall from prior reports in our E-News for May, June and December 2022. In fact, he took it personally because his paternal grandparents had been murdered in the Odesa (Ukraine) Massacre of 1941. Now, millions of innocent civilians were again being devastated by bombs and bullets.

Through the Jewish Federation of Greater Lansing, Ody learned that Ukrainians desperately needed ambulances to transport elderly and infirm refugees out of harm's way. So, in March 2022, he made it his personal mission to buy, refurbish, and deliver an ambulance to Odessa with his own funds. But folks in his community had bigger ideas. As word of his humanitarian mission spread, hundreds of people, businesses, health systems and other nonprofit organizations—locally, as well as overseas—began contributing. The 15 Rotary Clubs of Michigan's District 6360 stepped up big time, as did Rotary Clubs in Suceava, Romania, and Dnipro, Ukraine.

As a result, four trauma-ready ambulances have been delivered directly to war-torn Ukraine, along with a transit van and whole shipping container loaded with medical supplies. "These contributions are intended to help people of any faith or no faith at all," he adds. "They are there to help our fellow human beings." Airfares for Spring Escapes to Warm Places

Ready for a change of scenery after the latest blizzard and Arctic freeze? We went scouting for nonstop roundtrips to warmer places using Skyscanner.com and spot-checked airfares originating at DTW for the sample dates of Saturday, Feb. 24, to Sunday, March 3. Among the search criteria we used: Flights had to be direct to the destination both ways, and the return flight had to arrive at DTW in time for you to catch our last run at 9:45 or 10 p.m. to Ann Arbor, Brighton and East

Lansing.

You can easily find lower prices—and a greater selection of destinations—if you're willing to change planes on your outbound or inbound trip or both.
