A "Must" for Rescheduling a Hytch Ride

As you may know, Hytch is a fleet of branded minivans that connect Michigan Flyer passengers with their bus at the East Lansing Marriott right from—or to—the door of their home, workplace, or another location in the Hytch service area, which includes every address in a roughly four-mile radius from the Marriott.

So what happens if your return flight into Detroit Metro Airport is delayed or canceled, and you have to rebook your Michigan Flyer ride to East Lansing? Just be sure

to reschedule your Flyer ride first, and your related Hytch ride after that. This is because our system will NOT permit you to reserve a Hytch ride separately from a Flyer trip. Find more details about Hytch at this link.



Even Lower Fares for D2A2 Express Commuters

Prices are already cheap for the D2A2 Express Bus between Ann Arbor and Detroit—generally just \$6 one way if you buy a ticket online, or \$8 if you buy at the bus. But did you know that D2A2 also sells pass books that can lower your transportation cost even more? For example, a book of 10 passes offers 10 one-way trips between D2A2's stops at Detroit's Grand Circus Park and Ann Arbor's Blake Transit Center for \$5 each, or

\$50 total. And if you're a frequent commuter, the \$100 supersaver book of 50 passes can lower your cost to just \$2 each way. More info here: https://d2a2.com/fares/.



Reserve Seats Early—Here Come the College Students!

If you're planning to ride with us between mid-August and Labor Day, it would be wise to reserve your seat soon. That's because college students will once again flood into East Lansing and Ann Arbor—and many will be using Michigan Flyer-AirRide.

About 50,000 undergraduate and graduate students will be arriving at Michigan State University, where classes begin on Monday, Aug. 28. Classes will also begin that same day at the University of Michigan. Roughly 50,000 students will be coming to each

campus, along with upwards of 15,000 faculty and staff members. All of which helps to explain why the resumption of classes gives the mid-Michigan economy an estimated \$2 billion boost.

Turkish Airlines to Begin Flights from DTW this Fall

Turkish Airlines will begin serving passengers at Detroit Metropolitan Airport (DTW) on Nov. 15, connecting Midwest travelers to Turkey's tourism hub, Istanbul, and the airline's more than 340 destinations worldwide. At first, the airline will operate three flights per week on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday between DTW and Istanbul Airport (IST). As for pricing, a non-stop, economy-class, roundtrip leaving DTW on Friday, Dec. 8, and returning one week later would cost \$1,220. Note that on Dec. 25, Turkish Airlines will add Saturday to its DTW schedule. See flight schedules at

Ann Arbor Art Fair 2023. Drawing nearly half a million attendees over three days, it's the largest juried art fair in the nation, with works by about 1,000 artists displayed (and for sale) over 30 city blocks downtown. You'll find art in virtually every medium—handcrafted ceramics, jewelry, leather and metalworks, painting, photography, sculpture, wood, and more. In addition, there will be dining and sidewalk sales, <u>plus live music</u> and art activities.

Now in its 63rd year, the fair is actually three independently juried, nonprofit art fairs in one (Ann Arbor Street Art Fair, The Original; Ann Arbor Summer Art Fair; and Ann Arbor State Street Art Fair.) They all take place concurrently today, July 20, 10 a.m.— 9 p.m.; on Friday, July 21, 10 a.m.— 9 p.m.; and Saturday, July 22, 10 a.m.— 8 p.m. Click here to download a map of the event. 

How to Speed Through Airport Security

So you're going to fly back to Detroit Metro Airport after a vacation near one America's most popular cities, such as Chicago, Honolulu, Miami, New York, Orlando, Palm Beach, St. Louis, San Diego, San Francisco, Seattle, etc. Do you really need to get to the local airport two hours before your flight? It depends.

If you plan to go through the usual TSA security screening with the herd of most other passengers, the answer is Yes. Otherwise, you might miss your flight. That's because—after navigating through the airport, using a kiosk to pay for a checked bag and print your boarding pass, and then enduring a wait to show your ID and hand over the bag at check-in—you finally get to join the line for security screening, which could itself be an hour long. You can get some idea of what you'll be up against at TSA Wait Times.

Or, you could save a LOT of time and stress by simply enrolling in TSA PreCheck® and/or Clear®+.

TSA PreCheck®

With this program, you'll likely get through screening by the Transportation Security Administration (TSA) in less than five minutes, as well as avoid having to remove your shoes, belt, jacket, watch, and laptop for inspection.





For a \$78 nonrefundable application fee, you can enroll for five years. The process is simple:

Apply online. Schedule a 10-15 minute background check at the nearest enrollment center. Then start using your nine-digit Known Traveler Number (KTN) when making flight reservations.

The KTN (which you receive shortly after the background check) will be printed on your boarding pass and embedded in its barcode. When TSA scans it at the security checkpoint—voila!—you'll be directed to the speedy PreCheck lane. Even better, the fee may be covered as a benefit of a credit card you already carry.

CLEAR©

A private service that lets you skip having to present ID documents (a driver's license, passport, etc.), CLEAR© confirms your identity with a scan of your eyes and fingerprints. It can be used with or without TSA PreCheck© to zoom through security at most major airports. Together, the two provide the quickest path to your airplane.

Basically, CLEAR© turns your biometrics into an encrypted code, i.e., a unique pattern of ones and zeros. Then, every time you check in at an airport, it matches your fingerprints and eyes to the code. So, you can just proceed to the physical security screening, where—if you have PreCheck, too—you can keep all your clothes on and leave your laptop or tablet in its

It costs \$189 to enroll for 12 months, and the fee may be at least partly covered by a credit card you already carry. For example, the basic American Express Green Card will pay up to \$189 a year in statement credits toward a CLEAR© membership if you pay for it with the card. Enrolling takes only a few minutes. Get started online here: https://www.clearme.com/enroll.

Alternatively, you can also reserve a spot online for free, without enrolling in CLEAR[®]. Also, be aware that TSA PreCheck© and CLEAR© are geared toward travelers at domestic U.S. airports. For international travel, you'd be wise to sign up for a program like Global Entry.

A Salute to East Lansing for Its Stand Against Hate

In case you missed it, a 19-year-old neo-Nazi who allegedly planned to massacre members of a Jewish synagogue in East Lansing was thwarted on June 16 by the FBI and other law enforcement personnel. The threatened attack was featured prominently in Local, national, and international.news.

"This shook our Jewish community to the core," says Michigan Flyer VP Ody Norkin, especially since the possibility of bloodshed is all too real after a gunman killed three Michigan State University students and critically wounded five others just last February.

Shaarey Zedek, the Jewish congregation apparently

targeted in the latest instance, is one of two major Jewish synagogues in the Greater Lansing Jewish Federation (the other being Kehillat Israel). Both have contributed mightily to Ody's humanitarian mission to deliver ambulances and transit vehicles, as well as shipping containers full of medical supplies, to ease suffering among the people of war-torn Ukraine, regardless of religion.

The City of East Lansing responded to the latest threat by adopting a <u>resounding resolution of support</u> for the Jewish community that says in part, "the Mayor and City Council state unequivocally that there is no home here for the politics of hate, for white supremacy or neo-Nazism ... East Lansing stands together as a community that embraces the interconnection of diversity in all its forms ... and we call on this community to embrace the philosophy of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. who wrote in part, "Love is the greatest force in the universe."

All of us at Michigan Flyer applaud the City of East Lansing for its strong resolution of solidarity with the Jewish community.
