Reserve Seats Early—Here Come the College Students!

If you're planning to ride with us between mid-August and Labor Day, it would be wise to reserve your seat soon. That's because college students will once again flood into East Lansing and Ann Arbor—and many will be using Michigan Flyer.

About 50,000 undergraduate and graduate students, plus upwards of 15,000 faculty and staff members, will be coming to both Michigan State University and the University of Michigan because classes begin on Monday, Aug. 26. So it's little wonder that the resumption of classes gives the mid-Michigan economy an estimated \$2 billion boost.

A Mobile Passport App Speeds International Travelers Through Customs at DTW

On July 9, U.S. Customs and Border Protection at Detroit Metro Airport began allowing international travelers to use a mobile app that streamlines the inspection process for entering the U.S. The Mobile Passport Control app—available for free download at the Apple Store and Google Play—enables travelers to securely submit their travel documents, photo, and customs declaration information through their smartphone or other mobile device.

After downloading the app, users are prompted to create a profile with their passport information. Folks who use the MPC app don't have to complete a paper form and may experience shorter wait times. More details here. The MPC program, launched in 2014, is available at 51 locations, including 33 U.S. international airports, 14 preclearance

airport locations, and four seaports of entry. It's used by more than 1.8 million travelers a year.



What is Delta's Longest Domestic Route from DTW?

Perhaps no surprise, Delta Airline's longest nonstop flight soars 4,470 miles from Detroit to Honolulu (HNL) and operates daily. The Hawaii-bound flight is scheduled to arrive at 4:01 p.m. local time, about 9.5 hours after departing from DTW at 12:25 p.m. The red-eye return flight lands at DTW at around 6 a.m., after leaving HNL at 3:20 p.m. An economy-class roundtrip ticket costs \$1,899, though you can save roughly \$300-\$600 if you book your flight a few months in advance, or if you don't mind a long layover at another airport enroute.



Delta Extends DTW's Middle East Reach with EL AL Agreement

Early this year, Delta Air Lines and EL AL Israel Airlines launched a strategic partnership to "codeshare" (sell seats on each other's planes) and offer reciprocal frequent-flyer benefits. So, customers flying between the U.S. and Israel can conveniently check in with either carrier to get boarding passes for their entire trip, with bags checked through to their destination.

But the biggest benefit has been more daily connections between Detroit and Tel Aviv. Despite the ongoing conflicts in the Middle East, demand for travel to and from Ben Gurion International Airport (TLV) in Israel remains high. The partnership between Delta and EL AL has helped lower roundtrip airfares to the \$1,500-\$2,000 range due to the addition of 10 daily connections with DTW: Once each day via London, Newark, Boston, Ft. Lauderdale and Miami, plus five more via New York's JFK airport.



East Lansing MSU Summer Carillon Concert Series

For three more Wednesdays—July 24 & 31, and Aug. 7—the 49 carillon bells of historic Beaumont Tower will begin ringing at 6 p.m., rain or shine, for this 27th annual concert series. Everyone is welcome to bring a picnic, chair or blanket to enjoy the talents of the expert carillonists performing on the bells. These events are FREE and open to the public.

The remaining concerts feature carillonists Deborah Hennig of Stratford, Ontario; Kayla Gunderson of Chicago; and Alan Bowman from Dayton, Ohio. You can tour the tower and view the bells after each concert. A gift from John W. Beaumont (class of 1882), the tower was dedicated in 1929 and renovated in 1996. Beneath the clock is a crisp Art Deco relief, "The Sower," by sculptor Lee Lawrie. There are 73 steps up the stairs to the playing cabin, which is behind the clocks.

After his intimate "I Go Back 2023 Tour," the eight-time Entertainer of the Year comes to Detroit's Ford Field (2000 Brush St.) on Saturday, Aug. 10, at 5 p.m. <u>Tickets \$95-\$300+</u>. The only country artist to be on Billboard's Top 10 Touring Artists of the Last 25 Years for the past 14 years is bringing old friends and new to Detroit.

Joining Chesney is the multiple GRAMMY-winning Zac Brown Band, enjoying their 12th CMA Group of the Year nomination; Megan Moroney is 2023 CMA Song of the Year winner and "When The Sun Goes Down" duet partner of Uncle Kracker, known for his hits "Follow Me" and "Drift Away."

NOTE: <u>The D2A2 Express Bus</u> from Ann Arbor's Blake Transit Center (BTC) to Detroit's Grand Circus Park (1508 Park Ave.) can get you to within about a half mile of Ford Field.

Using <u>Skyscanner.com</u>, we spot-checked prices for domestic roundtrips originating at Detroit Metro Airport (DTW) on Friday, Oct. 11, and returning on Sunday, Oct. 20. Among our search criteria: Flights had to be nonstop in each direction, and the return flight had to arrive at DTW in time for passengers to catch our last run at 9:45 p.m. or 10:00 p.m. to Ann Arbor, Brighton, and East Lansing.

NOTE: Lower prices than these are surely available for anyone who is flexible about the dates of travel, or willing to change planes once or more enroute to their destination. Our sample economy roundtrip fares include taxes but not necessarily baggage or other "extras."
