Check Out Michigan Flyer's Expanded New Schedule!



You asked for it. Now we're delivering.

Last December, we surveyed riders to find out, among other things, how we could improve their passenger experience. Their overwhelming answer was to expand our schedule to offer more frequent runs between East Lansing, Whitmore Lake*, Ann Arbor and Detroit Metro Airport.

So, starting on Aug. 25, Michigan Flyer will expand to 14 daily roundtrips. You can <u>view</u> our current and new schedules here.

Most notably, our last daily westbound run from Detroit Metro Airport (DTW) will be an hour later than now. It will depart the Evans Terminal at 10:45 p.m. and the McNamara Terminal at 11:00 p.m. This will give many travelers the option of reserving flights that arrive at DTW later in the evening and are often less costly than earlier flights.

The new runs are available for advance booking NOW through the "Book a Trip" feature on our website at MichiganFlyer.com.

*PLEASE NOTE: To more accurately describe the location of boarding points along our route—and to avoid causing confusion among passengers—we've replaced Brighton with Whitmore Lake. That's our actual stop, and it's about eight miles south of Brighton. Specifically, our location is at the MDOT Park & Ride lot off Exit 53 of U.S. 23 at Whitmore Lake Rd. and 8 Mile Rd. From there, of course, Michigan Flyer continues to serve the people of Brighton and other communities throughout Livingston County.

High Marks to DAX



The <u>Detroit Air Xpress</u>—or DAX for short—is the pilot express bus service that connects Downtown Detroit to Detroit Metro Airport (DTW). This past March marked its first anniversary. DAX was created by the Regional Transit Authority of Southeast Michigan (RTA) and is operated by Indian Trails and Michigan Flyer. It's a pilot service funded by a \$2.5 million grant through the Federal Highway Administration's Carbon Reduction Program.

Last month, we reported some of the responses we received from the recent DAX ridership survey. Now, more responses are in, and the good news continues:

- 99% of riders say they got to their stop on time
- 99% of riders are satisfied with the cleanliness of the bus
- 61% of riders would use a rideshare if DAX didn't exist, meaning they're saving a lot of money

In short, DAX riders love the comfort, cleanliness, timeliness, and overall experience of the service.

Checked Bags Don't Fly for Free Anymore

Earlier this year, the Money website reported that Southwest Airlines—which had not charged passengers for the first two checked bags since it was founded nearly 60 years ago—would begin imposing luggage fees in May. As a result, every U.S. airline now charges passengers for checked bags. Depending on the carrier, baggage fees reportedly make up between 3 percent and 21 percent of revenue.

We can't fault the airlines for doing what they must to make a go of it. Every industry faces its own imperatives for economic survival.

pius tnings to see and do, dining experiences, public transit and more, nave made tnis a must-visit destination. Which is why <u>Travel & Leisure recently named Detroit one of the top places to go for big-city thrills.</u>

But first, two fun facts: (1) Detroit was dubbed the "Motor City" in the early 1900s when the "Big Three" automakers emerged there—Ford, General Motors, and Chrysler; (2) During Prohibition—codified in the U.S. Constitution in 1920 and repealed in 1933—an estimated 70 percent of illegal alcohol came into the United States through Detroit.

Now, on to the top attractions in Detroit, according to Tripadvisor. Informed by traveler reviews and ratings, these include:

- 1. **The Motown Museum**, home of Hitsville, USA. Launched by entrepreneur Berry Gordy, Jr., in 1959, it sparked a revolution in sound and the careers of many musical artists including the Miracles, The Supremes, The Temptations, The Four Tops, Stevie Wonder, Marvin Gaye, and The Jackson 5.
- 2. **The Detroit Institute of Arts**. Founded in 1885, it covers 658,000 square feet that includes more than 140 galleries, a 1,140-seat auditorium, a 333-seat lecture/recital hall, an art reference library, a state-of-the-art conservation department, and artist Diego Rivera's amazing murals.
- 3. **The Guardian Building**. An Art Deco landmark with historical tours, stunning city views, and intricate interior details.



downtown Detroit, it's rich with natural beauty and historical and cultural resources. The park provides spectacular views of Detroit to the north and Canada to the south.

- 5. **Comerica Park**. Home of the Detroit Tigers major league baseball team, featuring a Ferris wheel and retro styling amid city views.
- 6. **Detroit Riverfront**. A popular riverwalk extending from the Ambassador Bridge on the west to Belle Isle on the east, it spans 5.5 miles along the Detroit River.
- 7. **The Ford Piquette Avenue Plant**. The birthplace of the Ford Model T car, the Ford Piquette Avenue Plant is recognized as one of the most significant automotive heritage sites in the world. The Ford Model T was developed here and introduced in 1908 as a 1909 model.
- 8. **Eastern Market**. It's enormous—the largest historic public market district in the U.S. More than 150 food and specialty businesses are located within the market, selling an incredible array of produce, meat, spices, jams, flowers, poultry and more. It was added to the National Registry of Historic Places in 1978.
- 9. **Detroit Historical Museum**. Established in 1921 by the Detroit Historical Society, this museum has been committed to preserving and bringing to life Detroit's vibrant history with interactive exhibits, engaging displays, and family-friendly experiences that celebrate the city's industries, culture, and stories.
- 10. **Ford Field**. Home of the resurging NFL Football Team, the Detroit Lions, Ford Field is a multi-purpose indoor stadium located in Downtown Detroit.

NOTE: The <u>D2A2 Express Bus</u> from Ann Arbor's Blake Transit Center (BTC) to Detroit's Grand Circus Park can put you within walking distance of many of these sites. So can <u>Detroit Air Xpress</u> or DAX, which connects Downtown Detroit with Detroit Metro Airport. Michigan Flyer operates D2A2 and DAX, and can connect you with both.

<u>Kommuna Lux -</u> <u>Fundraiser Concert for the People of Ukraine</u>


Come fall in love with Odesa, Ukraine—


Elvis: In Person

Bloody Work: Lexington and Concord 1775

Serious history buffs are in for a real treat. In recognition of the upcoming 250th anniversary of the American Revolution, this exhibit at U-M's William L. Clements Library explores the early months of 1775 in Massachusetts, the battles of Lexington and Concord, and related events that ignited the nearly eight-year war between the British Empire and the American colonies.

Visitors have the opportunity to see original historical manuscripts, letters, documents, newspapers, and artwork that reveal aspects of the bloody work of the Empire and various individuals. Among the items on display are British General Thomas Gage's draft orders for the Concord Expedition; a bundle of letters collected by former Sons of Liberty supporter Dr. Benjamin Church, which he secretly turned over to British Army intelligence; letters by Silas Deane, John Hancock, and Rachel Revere; and much more.

The exhibit is free and open to the public Monday-Friday, Noon-4 p.m., until Sept. 19. It's about a half-mile-walk from Michigan Flyer's location at the Blake Transit Center to the Clements Library at 909 S. University Ave. Or, you can wiew.much of the exhibit-online. Also, you could wiew.much of the library's collections.

Among our search criteria: Flights had to be nonstop in each direction, and the return flight had to arrive at DTW in time for passengers to catch our last run at 10:45 p.m. or 11:00 p.m. to Ann Arbor, Whitmore Lake, and East Lansing.

NOTE: You may well find different fares for nearly the same roundtrips on Expedia, Kayak, or Orbitz—or by buying tickets directly from a carrier like Delta Air Lines. Lower prices than these are surely available for anyone who's flexible about the dates of travel, or willing to change planes once or more enroute to their destination.
