Why Folks Choose Our New Hytch Service

At Michigan Flyer, we like to check in frequently with customers to ask how well we're doing. So, now that we've officially launched Hytch—our new door-to-door service—we asked a couple of passengers to weigh in on their experiences.

But first, in case you're new to the concept, let's review. Hytch is a branded minivan that connects Michigan Flyer passengers with their bus at the East Lansing

Marriott right from—or to—the door of their home, workplace, or another location in the Hytch service area. This includes every address in roughly a four-mile radius from the Marriott, including downtown Lansing, the Michigan State University campus, parts of Meridian Township and more. Hytch rides are \$10 per person, one way, and available to Michigan Flyer passengers when they book their bus trips online.

Each Hytch minivan is a new-model, five-passenger, ride-share vehicle (one is wheelchair accessible) with an experienced driver. Rides are available Sunday through Friday from 3 a.m. to 11 p.m., but not on Saturday. Find complete details about Hytch at this link.

WestJet Begins Direct Flights to and from DTW
The Canadian airline's new summer schedule enables

Detroit Metro Airport customers to fly directly to Calgary—and from there to other cities across Canada—for the first time since 2005. WestJet's summer schedule offers five weekly nonstop roundtrips between DTW and Calgary International Airport (YYC). In a quick spot-check, we found nonstop roundtrips available for \$555.87 at WestJet.com for flights originating at DTW on July 7 and returning from YYC on July 15.

Calgary offers the nearby scenic splendor of Banff National Park in the Canadian Rockies, with stunning views of turquoise Lake Louise. Meanwhile, in town, you'll find top attractions like the Heritage Village Historical Park, Calgary Zoo, and Calgary Tower. As a longstanding partner of Delta Airlines, WestJet also gives Canadian travelers access to over 150 U.S. destinations on a single ticket, which promises to bring more visitors to Michigan.

Inside Our New Bus Shelter in Brighton

Our Brighton passengers now have a brand new bus shelter at our stop in the Meijer parking lot. It not only serves as a place to rest with some protection from the weather, but also offers a couple of electronic amenities. First and foremost, it includes an electronic bus-tracker monitor that continuously displays updated



arrival times for Michigan Flyer buses, so passengers needn't wonder, "Where the heck is my bus?" The shelter also features LED lighting and USB ports for passengers who'd like to charge their electronic devices.

Note that the data used by the bus-tracker sign is delivered via WiFi from satellite-based GPS systems and computers on each of our motorcoaches, which monitor bus location and speed to predict arrival times. The same bus tracking info is available to ALL

passengers through our website at https://www.michiganflyer.com/bus-tracker. For quick access, you may want to bookmark this link in the web browser on your smartphone.

NOTE: A Capital Area Transportation Authority bus can get you from East Lansing to Adado Riverfront Park fairly quickly and for just \$1.25. Near the corner of westbound Grand River Ave. and M.A.C. (a short walk from our location at the East Lansing Marriott), catch CATA's #1 bus to downtown Lansing, then get off at Grand Ave.

Ann Arbor Art Fair 2023. Drawing nearly half a million attendees over three days, it's the largest juried art fair in the nation, with works by about 1,000 artists displayed (and for sale) over 30 city blocks downtown. You'll find art in virtually every medium—handcrafted ceramics, jewelry, leather and metalworks, painting, photography, sculpture, wood, and more. In addition, there will be dining and sidewalk sales, plus live music and art activities.

Now in its 63rd year, the fair is actually three independently juried, nonprofit art fairs in one (Ann Arbor Street Art Fair, The Original; Ann Arbor Summer Art Fair; and Ann Arbor State Street Art Fair). They all take place

concurrently on Thursday, July 20, 10 a.m.– 9 p.m.; Friday, July 21, 10 a.m.– 9 p.m.; and Saturday, July 22, 10 a.m.– 8 p.m. Click here to download a map of the event. FREE and fun for all ages.

Michigan Challenge Balloonfest. The 38th annual balloonfest features carnival rides, kid attractions, fireworks, and the spectacular balloon launches, fly-ins, and evening glow.

The <u>event schedule</u> spans three days—Friday, June 23, 2 p.m.-11 p.m.; Saturday June 24, 6 a.m.-11 p.m.; Sunday, June 25, 6 a.m.-10 p.m.—and is hosted by the Howell Area Chamber of Commerce. Admission is \$5 per day per person, but free for children three and under. <u>See the schedule of events here</u>. The event takes place at the <u>Howell High School Complex</u>, 1200 W. Grand River Rd., Howell, Mich. That's about a 20-

minute drive West on I-96 from our location at the Brighton Meijer. Parking is free.

Sample Airfares for Late Summer Getaways

If you're thinking of getting out of Dodge one last week before K-12 schools and colleges resume classes, now is the time to start planning. Using Kayak.com and Skyscanner.com, we spot-checked prices for domestic roundtrips originating at Detroit Metro Airport (DTW) on Friday, Aug. 11, and returning on Saturday, Aug. 19. Good news: Fares are generally lower than they were six months ago. Among our search criteria: Flights had to be nonstop in each direction, and the return flight

had to arrive at DTW in time for passengers to catch our last run at 8:15 p.m./8:30 p.m. to Ann Arbor, Brighton, and East Lansing.

NOTE: Lower prices than these are often available for anyone who is flexible about the dates of travel, or willing to change planes once or more enroute to their destination. Our sample economy roundtrip fares include taxes but not necessarily baggage or other "extras."

Happy 247th Birthday, America!

On July 4, 1776—247 years ago—the Founding Fathers of America's original 13 colonies adopted the Declaration of Independence. Drafted largely by Thomas Jefferson, it condemns and proclaims freedom from the oppressive rule of Great Britain.

Including this famous passage—"We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness"—it ends with fighting

words: "And for the support of this Declaration, with a firm reliance on the protection of divine Providence, we mutually pledge to each other our Lives, our Fortunes and our sacred Honor."

Since then, July 4 has been celebrated with fireworks, parades, picnics and concerts as America's Birthday!

Fascinating facts about the founding of our great nation:

When the Declaration of Independence was signed, the fighting had been ongoing for more than a year since April 1775. That's when local militiamen fought British soldiers in the Battles of Lexington and Concord, Massachusetts, marking the "shot heard round the world" that started the Revolutionary War.

- George Washington, who would become America's first president, did not sign the Declaration along with other Founding Fathers in Philadelphia. He was in what's now Manhattan, N.Y., commanding the Continental Army as it prepared to battle the British again. On July 9, he received a copy of the Declaration from John Hancock and read it to his ecstatic troops, some of whom promptly pulled down a nearby statue of Britain's King George III.
- ✓ In 1778, France joined the war on the side of the colonists. Its assistance helped the Continental Army to
 force the British surrender at Yorktown, Va., in 1781. Great Britain formally recognized the independence of the
 United States in the Treaty of Paris on Sept. 3, 1783.
- ✓ John Adams, America's second president, and Thomas Jefferson, our third president, were both Founding Fathers of America. As young men, they were political rivals. In later life, they became close friends. Both died on the same day—July 4, 1826, our 50th Independence Day.
