

Meet Driver Jacqulin "Quay" Bonner-Norris

One of our newest Michigan Flyer drivers, Jacqulin Bonner-Norris, who goes by his nickname "Quay," passed Indian Trails' six-week intensive driver training course and

has been on the job since last October.

Still, he continues to look for input from our veteran drivers. "That saying, 'You can't teach an old dog new tricks'—I don't believe it," says Quay. "I'm always asking senior drivers for their knowledge and for answers to any questions I might have. This helps me improve in doing my job."

A native of Flint, Mich., Quay graduated from Flint Northern High School and attended Mott Community College. He was working as a janitor at Flint's Hurley Hospital—cleaning and sanitizing operating rooms after surgeries—when his brother-in-law suggested he check out Indian Trails, our parent company.

"I'd never heard of Indian Trails until I looked it up," he said. "A driver's position offered more money and more quality time with my family. So, I thought, 'Why not apply and see if I like it?" Coming up on his first year with Michigan Flyer, Quay is glad he made the switch.

Thorough Training Comes First

When he began our driver training program, Quay already had a chauffeur's license, but the largest vehicle he'd driven was a 12-passenger van.

"Indian Trails' training was so interesting," he said. "They teach you everything from the components of your bus, to how to watch the road, create distance, make wide turns, maneuver through city streets, offer great customer service and more."

Quay said he was so intent on doing a good job and passing his road test that he practiced another two hours a day after class was over. "It was still a little nervewracking when the test day came."

Now, his early morning shifts with Michigan Flyer have become more like second nature to him. One of the biggest perks of his job is meeting the passengers on each of his shifts.

"I love being around people and being able to hear their stories," Quay says. "I can talk to anyone and it's also fun to meet people from different countries. I had one passenger who gave me a loaf of bread she'd made from her culture. That was so nice."

A Service That Matters

Since Indian Trails was new to him, so was the popularity of our Michigan Flyer service between East Lansing, Brighton, Ann Arbor and Detroit Metropolitan Airport.

"Our passengers love this service and they're so glad it's available," says Quay. "It's a great alternative to driving to the airport. It saves them money on gas and parking, it reduces their stress, and they appreciate the comfort of our buses."

Like all of our drivers, Quay is intent on providing a smooth, safe ride for the passengers on his bus: "I feel almost like a pilot of an airplane. I'm the one in control and I have lives in my hands. I'm going to do everything I can to ensure their safety."

In his downtime, Quay loves spending time with his family and pursuing his personal passions of music (he plays the drums), video games, and sports. When it's time for work, he enjoys the people he works with, and the fact that Indian Trails has a 114-year history in Michigan. "That's really something, how long we've been around. We're beating out everyone else."

Reduced Michigan Flyer Schedule on July 4th

Due to the Firecracker 5K and Mile Fun Run on Thursday, July 4, in Ann Arbor, followed by the annual Jaycees Fourth of July Parade, not all of our regularly scheduled roundtrips between Ann Arbor and Detroit Metro Airport will be operated on Independence Day. We will NOT be operating Eastbound routes #8008 or #8010, nor Westbound routes #8003, #8005, #8007. See our Schedule here. D2A2 Express Bus Expands Summer Service

Reminder: The popular <u>D2A2 Express Bus</u> that makes frequent daily runs between Ann Arbor's Blake Transit Center and Detroit's Grand Circus Park is currently operating a special "midnight summer run" from Detroit to Ann Arbor. While the usual last run is at 11 p.m., every Friday and Saturday night through Labor Day weekend an

additional run will depart at 11:55 p.m. This gives visitors more time to enjoy the nighttime attractions of Downtown Detroit.

If you're looking to find Michigan Flyer at DTW— or help a friend do so—please note that the airport is changing its wayfinding signs so that we're now included in the category of "Public Transit."

While that may be helpful, your best bet for finding us at the **McNamara Terminal** is to simply follow signs for "Ticketing/Check-In."

They'll guide you to our location on Level 3 (a.k.a. Departures Level). Our stop is at the exterior doors marked "International Ticketing/Check-In, Air France, Aeromexico." Nearby, you should see an "AirRide Route 787" sign, which indicates you're in the right place.

At the **Evans Terminal**, we pick up and drop off passengers at Stall #1 of the Ground Transportation Center.

Drawing nearly half a million attendees over three days, it's the largest juried art fair in the nation, with works by about 1,000 artists displayed (and for sale) over 30 city blocks downtown. You'll find art in virtually every medium—handcrafted ceramics, jewelry, leather and metalworks, painting, photography, sculpture, wood, and more. In addition, there will be dining and sidewalk sales, plus <u>live music on three stages</u> and <u>plenty of art activities</u>.

The annual art fair is actually three independently juried, nonprofit art fairs in one (Ann Arbor Street Art Fair, The Original; Ann Arbor Summer Art Fair; and Ann Arbor State Street Art Fair). They all take place concurrently on Thursday and Friday, July 18 and 19, 10 a.m. – 9 p.m., and Saturday, July 20, 10 a.m. – 8 p.m. Click here to download a map of the event. Brighton Michigan Challenge Balloonfest

The 39th annual balloonfest features carnival rides, kid attractions, fireworks, and the spectacular daily balloon launches, fly-ins, and the popular evening Glow.

The <u>event schedule</u> spans three days—Friday, June 28, 2 p.m.-8:45 p.m.; Saturday June 29, 6:30 a.m.-10 p.m.; Sunday, June 30, 6 a.m.-8 p.m.—and is hosted by the Howell Area Chamber of Commerce. Admission is \$5 per day per person, but free for children three and under. The event takes place at the <u>Howell High School Complex</u>, 1200 W. Grand River Rd., Howell, Mich. That's about a 20-minute drive West on I-96 from our location at the Brighton Meijer. Parking is free.

Detroit Journey & Def Leppard 2024 Stadium Tour

Two of rock's most iconic bands—Def Leppard & Journey—perform at Comerica Park on Thursday, July 18, at 6 p.m.—and they'll be joined by the Steve Miller Band for an amazing musical evening. All three have been named to the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame. Standard admission tickets \$59.50-\$369.50+ fee.



Since 1973, Journey has earned 19 top 40 singles, 25 gold and platinum albums, and has sold over 100 million albums globally. Their Greatest Hits album is certified 15 times-platinum, and their song "Don't Stop Believin'" has been streamed over one billion times.

Def Leppard's career includes numerous hit singles, ground-breaking multi-platinum albums, and more than 110 million albums sold worldwide. These include two all-time best-sellers— Pyromania and Hysteria—which feature such hits as "Rock of Ages", "Pour Some Sugar on Me" and "Foolin."

The Steve Miller Band has also been a major influence on rock music. Their Greatest Hits 1974-78 is among the 25 best-selling albums of all time, including tunes like "Jungle Love," "Take the Money and Run," and "Rock'n' Me."

NOTE: <u>The D2A2 Express Bus</u> from Ann Arbor's Blake Transit Center (BTC) to Detroit's Grand Circus Park (1508 Park Ave.) can get you to within a half mile or 5-minute walk of Comerica Park.

If you're thinking of a vacation getaway before K-12 schools and colleges resume classes, now is the time to start planning. Using <u>Skyscanner.com</u>, we spot-checked prices for domestic roundtrips originating at Detroit Metro Airport (DTW) on Friday, Aug. 9, and returning on Saturday, Aug. 17. Among our search criteria: Flights had to be nonstop in each direction, and the return flight had to arrive at DTW in time for passengers to catch our last run at 9:45 p.m. or 10:00 p.m. to Ann Arbor, Brighton, and East Lansing.

NOTE: Lower prices than these are surely available for anyone who is flexible about the dates of travel, or willing to change planes once or more enroute to their destination. Our sample economy roundtrip fares include taxes but not necessarily baggage or other "extras."

Happy 248th Birthday, America!

On July 4, 1776—248 years ago—the Founding Fathers of America's original 13 colonies adopted the Declaration of Independence. Drafted largely by Thomas Jefferson, it proclaims freedom from the oppressive rule of Great Britain.

Including this famous passage—"We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness"—it ends with fighting words: "And for the support of this Declaration, with a firm reliance on the protection of divine Providence, we mutually pledge to each other our Lives, our Fortunes and our sacred Honor."

Since then, July 4 has been celebrated with fireworks, parades, picnics and concerts as America's Birthday!

Fascinating facts about the founding of our great nation:

- When the Declaration of Independence was signed, the fighting had been ongoing for more than a year—since April 1775. That's when local militiamen fought British soldiers in the Battles of Lexington and Concord, Massachusetts, marking the "shot heard round the world" that started the Revolutionary War.
- George Washington, who would become America's first president, did not sign
 the Declaration along with other Founding Fathers in Philadelphia. He was in
 what's now Manhattan, N.Y., commanding the Continental Army as it prepared
 to battle the British again. On July 9, he received a copy of the Declaration from
 John Hancock and read it to his ecstatic troops, some of whom promptly pulled
 down a nearby statue of Britain's King George III.
- In 1778, France joined the war on the side of the colonists. Its assistance helped the Continental Army to force the British surrender at Yorktown, Va., in 1781.

Great Britain formally recognized the independence of the United States in the Treaty of Paris on Sept. 3, 1783.

 John Adams, America's second president, and Thomas Jefferson, our third president, were both Founding Fathers of America. As young men, they were political rivals. In later life, they became close friends. Both died on the same day—July 4, 1826, our 50th Independence Day.
