United Airlines Expands Your Global Reach



United recently launched the biggest expansion of international destinations in its history with a Summer 2025 schedule that includes <u>service to eight new cities</u>: Ulaanbaatar, Mongolia; Kaohsiung, Taiwan; Nuuk, Greenland; Palermo, Italy; Bilbao, Spain; Madeira Island, Portugal; Faro, Portugal; and Dakar, Senegal.

So, United is now flying its largest-ever international schedule, with 800 daily flights to and from 147 international destinations. What's more, this fall, the airline plans to offer service to Bangkok, Thailand; and Ho Chi Minh City, Vietnam; Hong Kong; and Adelaide, Australia.

What's in it for you? The entire world if you'd like to explore it. Consider that—from Detroit Metro Airport (DTW)—it's just one nonstop flight to any of United's U.S. hubs (Chicago, Denver, Houston, Los Angeles, New York/Newark, San Francisco and Washington, D.C./Dulles).

"One key destination, for example, is Adelaide, Australia," notes Michigan Flyer VP Ody Norkin, who's also a veteran travel agent. "For the first time ever by any airline, United will fly nonstop from San Francisco to Adelaide. So United's DTW-SFO-ADL route will shave four hours off a very long trip and get you to Australia faster than any other carrier combination."



The San Francisco hub also serves Manila and Cebu in the Philippines; and San Jose, Costa Rica; plus about 30 other cities in the Pacific and Central American regions.

Similarly, a nonstop flight from DTW to United's hub at Newark/New York can easily put you one direct flight away from dozens of cities in Italy, Spain, Portugal, Greece, Croatia, Greenland, and Mexico.

The Washington/Dulles hub offers direct United connections with Venice, Italy; Nice, France; Dakar, Senegal; Cape Town and Johannesburg, South Africa; Accra, Ghana and Lagos, Nigeria; and Marrakesh, Morocco. The hardest part may be figuring out where you want to go next.

Happy First Birthday, DAX!



The <u>Detroit Air Xpress</u>—or DAX for short—is the pilot express bus service that connects Downtown Detroit to Detroit Metro Airport (DTW). This past March it turned one year old. DAX was created by the Regional Transit Authority of Southeast Michigan (RTA), and is operated by Michigan Flyer. So far, as a pilot service funded by a \$2.5 million grant through the Federal Highway Administration's Carbon Reduction Program, the reviews are mighty good:

- 98% of riders are either very satisfied or satisfied with the service.
- 59% of DAX users are local residents.
- 40% of riders use DAX every time they travel to the airport.

We'll report more results from the DAX passenger survey as it becomes available.

Meet Your Driver, Tom Gates



Shortly after graduating from high school, Tom Gates joined the U.S. Marines, served for 20 years, and retired. When he returned to his hometown of Owosso, Mich., he decided to look for a job. "My dad, Nelson, had been a part-time driver for Indian Trails after he retired as police chief in Owosso, so I applied there," he says.

Tom thought his chances were slim since there were about 40 other candidates looking to become drivers: "I was surprised when I got the call to come in. It probably helped that some interviewers remembered my dad."

This year, Tom is celebrating his 20th anniversary with Indian Trails and his 18th as a Michigan Flyer driver. We first profiled him for this newsletter in 2013, when we highlighted his side-gig as a budding singer/songwriter and guitarist. While he still enjoys performing at open-mike opportunities, other pastimes have surfaced over the years. But Tom's main focus hasn't changed: It's doing his utmost to get his passengers safely to their destinations every time he's behind the wheel.

Like all new drivers at Indian Trails, after extensive in-house training Tom started out driving regular routes and group charter trips. One of his favorite charters involved taking a group of MSU logistical students to a conference in Memphis, Tenn., and exploring the city's famous Beale Street—"Home of the Blues"—and its live music venues. "I thought, 'Holy cow! This place is amazing!" he recalls.

The Rewards of Driving a Bus

When Tom transferred to Michigan Flyer in May 2007, the shuttle service had only been operating for about six months. "I was looking for a regular routine and this fit me perfectly," he says. "It feels stress-free, and I really enjoy the passengers."

Back then, drivers checked in passengers using a paper manifest. Today, it's all done electronically. Because the Flyer's parent company, Indian Trails, routinely updates its fleet of motorcoaches, drivers are always learning about new features and technologies that make the bus safer for them and the passengers they ferry between East Lansing, Brighton, Ann Arbor, and Detroit Metro Airport.

Tom is an annual recipient of the Cora Taylor Safe Driving Award, named after the cofounder of Indian Trails in 1910 and bestowed on drivers who complete a year without an avoidable accident.

"I love the company," says Tom, "It's had good leadership from the get-go."



One reason Tom joined the Marines was to see more of the world. In addition to serving a tour of duty in Iraq, his service also took him to both coasts of the United States, Okinawa, Japan, the Philippines, Germany, Norway, Iceland, Spain, Kuwait and South Korea.

He made a CD of the songs he wrote ("I think I gave away more than I sold") and then turned his attention to nature photography. If you've visited the Michigan Flyer office in East Lansing, you may have seen some of his framed photos gracing the walls. He also collects and polishes fossils, making them into pendants. His newest passion is to completely remodel his 1890s childhood home, which he inherited from his family.

D2A2 Express Bus Expands Summer Service

The popular <u>D2A2 Express Bus</u>, which makes frequent daily runs between Ann Arbor's Blake Transit Center and Detroit's Grand Circus Park, is now operating a special "midnight summer run" from Detroit to Ann Arbor. While the usual last run is at 11 p.m., an additional run will depart at 11:55 p.m. every Friday and Saturday night through Labor Day weekend. This gives visitors more time to enjoy the nighttime attractions of Downtown Detroit. (Note: D2A2 will not operate on July 4.)

Michigan Challenge Balloonfest

The 40th annual balloonfest features carnival rides, kid attractions, fireworks, and the spectacular daily balloon launches, fly-ins, and the ever-popular evening Glow, when about 20 hot-air balloons inflate on the launch field and glow their envelopes against the beautiful summer night sky.



The <u>event schedule</u> spans three days—Friday, June 27, 2 p.m.-11 p.m.; Saturday June 28, 6 a.m.-11 p.m.; Sunday, June 29, 6 a.m.-10 p.m.—and is hosted by the Howell Area Chamber of Commerce. <u>Admission is \$5 per day</u> per person plus fee, but free for children three and under. The event takes place at the Howell High School Complex, 1200 W. Grand River Rd., Howell, Mich. That's about a <u>22-minute drive</u> from our current Brighton stop at exit 53 of U.S. 23 then west on I-96 to Howell. Parking is free.


Ann Arbor Art Fair 2025

You'll find art in virtually every medium—handcrafted ceramics, jewelry, leather and metalworks, painting, photography, sculpture, wood, and more. In addition, there will be dining and sidewalk sales, plus <u>live music on two stages</u> and <u>plenty of art activities</u>.

This distinguished event features three unique, independently juried, nonprofit art fairs, all operating concurrently: <u>Ann Arbor Street Art Fair, The Original, The Guild's Ann Arbor Summer Art Fair</u>, and <u>Ann Arbor State Street District Art Fair</u>. Sample Airfares for Late Summer Getaways



If you're thinking of a vacation getaway before K-12 schools and colleges resume classes, now is the time to start planning. Using <u>Skyscanner.com</u>, we spot-checked prices for domestic roundtrips originating at Detroit Metro Airport (DTW) on Friday, Aug. 8, and returning on Sunday, Aug. 17. Among our search criteria: Flights had to be nonstop in each direction, and the return flight had to arrive at DTW in time for passengers to catch our last run at 9:45 p.m. or 10:00 p.m. to Ann Arbor, Brighton, and East Lansing.

NOTE: You may well find different fares for nearly the same roundtrips on Expedia, Kayak, or Orbitz—or by buying tickets directly from a carrier like Delta Air Lines. Lower prices than these are surely available for anyone who's flexible about the dates of travel, or willing to change planes once or more enroute to their destination. Happy 249th Birthday, America!



On July 4, 1776—249 years ago—the Founding Fathers of America's original 13 colonies adopted the Declaration of Independence. Drafted largely by Thomas Jefferson, it proclaims freedom from the oppressive rule of Great Britain.

Including this famous passage—"We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness"—it ends with fighting words: "And for the support of this Declaration, with a firm reliance on the protection of divine Providence, we mutually pledge to each other our Lives, our Fortunes and our sacred Honor."

Since then, July 4 has been celebrated with fireworks, parades, picnics and concerts as America's Birthday!

Fascinating facts about the founding of our great nation:

- When the Declaration of Independence was signed, the fighting had been ongoing for more than a year—since April 1775. That's when local militiamen fought British soldiers in the Battles of Lexington and Concord, Massachusetts, marking the "shot heard round the world" that started the Revolutionary War.
- George Washington, who would become America's first president, did not sign
 the Declaration along with other Founding Fathers in Philadelphia. He was in
 what's now Manhattan, N.Y., commanding the Continental Army as it prepared
 to battle the British again. On July 9, he received a copy of the Declaration from
 John Hancock and read it to his ecstatic troops, some of whom promptly pulled
 down a nearby statue of Britain's King George III.
- In 1778, France joined the war on the side of the colonists. Its assistance helped the Continental Army to force the British surrender at Yorktown, Va., in 1781. Great Britain formally recognized the independence of the United States in the Treaty of Paris on Sept. 3, 1783.
- John Adams, America's second president, and Thomas Jefferson, our third president, were both Founding Fathers of America. As young men, they were

political rivals. In later life, they became close friends. Both died on the same day—July 4, 1826, our 50th Independence Day.
