Ann Arbor's Blake Transit Center Bypassed on **U-M Football Saturdays**

If you're planning a Saturday trip with Michigan Flyer-AirRide between Ann Arbor and East Lansing or Detroit Metro Airport this fall, please know that on U-M home football game Saturdays some of our runs will bypass the BTC on the way to and from the airport. This will affect some of our runs before, during, and after the following home games:

Sept. 24: U-M vs. Maryland, Noon

Oct. 15: U-M vs. Penn State, TBA Oct. 29: U-M vs. Michigan State, TBA Nov. 12: U-M vs. Nebraska, TBA Nov. 19: U-M vs. Illinois, TBA

However, please note that some Michigan Flyer-AirRide runs will continue to stop at the BTC on these days. It's easy to find out which ones: Just check the "Book a Trip" feature on our website.

New Nonstop DTW Flights to Phoenix on Frontier Airlines

Starting this November, low-fare carrier Frontier Airlines will begin new daily nonstop service between Detroit Metro Airport (DTW) and Phoenix Sky Harbor International Airport (PHX). Using a sample Thanksgiving trip that departs Detroit at about 7 a.m. on Saturday, Nov. 19, and returns at 7 p.m. on Saturday, Nov. 26, we found roundtrips readily available at \$350—and with nonstop flights each way!

Just be aware that this carrier offers passengers "the ability to customize travel to their needs and budget." This means that adding one checked bag and ticket refundability to the free personal item allowed could bump up your overall cost by about \$160. Still, Frontier's many options are well worth exploring.

D2A2 Expands Weekend Express Service Between Detroit and Ann Arbor

The Regional Transit Authority of Southeast Michigan has announced that its Detroit-to-Ann Arbor Express Bus (D2A2) has doubled its weekend trips. The <u>new D2A2 weekend schedule</u> provides eight round trips between the two communities from 7:30 a.m. to midnight. The added trips give Ann Arbor-area residents more access to downtown Detroit's dining, entertainment and cultural venues on Saturday and Sunday.



DTW is Now Part of the Hidden Disabilities Sunflower Program

Any passenger with a physical, mental or neurological disability that may not be obvious can now choose to discreetly identify themselves at Detroit Metro Airport by wearing a Sunflower lanyard or wristband. The Sunflower symbol alerts airport workers that special attention or additional assistance may be needed.

The Hidden Disabilities Sunflower program is recognized by more than 160 airports worldwide. DTW customers who would like to obtain a Sunflower lanyard or wristband should email Community Outreach Manager Matt Virost at matthew.virost@wcaa.us. Note that the program

doesn't give passengers priority in lines, and travelers must still notify their airline if they need a wheelchair or other accommodations. Also, you can request assistance at TSA screening checkpoints or by calling the TSA Cares helpline (855-787-2227) before your trip.



Happy Autumn, Columbus Day & Indigenous Peoples' Day!

First Day of Fall—Sept. 22

Astronomically speaking, today—Thursday, Sept. 22—is the autumnal equinox or first day of autumn in Earth's Northern Hemisphere (North America, Europe, most of Asia, and northern Africa). After this, the Sun begins to rise later and set sooner. Summer is gone and winter is slowly but surely coming on, though it won't arrive until the Winter Solstice on December 21.

Columbus Day—Oct. 10

The second Monday of October (Oct. 10 this year) marks Columbus Day in the United States. It honors the Italian explorer Christopher Columbus, who launched the ships Niña, Pinta, and Santa Maria from the coast of Spain in 1492, intending to sail west to China, India and the Spice Islands of Asia. Instead, after 10 weeks, he landed in the Bahamas on Oct. 12, 1492, becoming the first European to arrive in what is now the U.S. In 1934, Congress declared Columbus Day a federal holiday, and it has since evolved into a celebration of Italian-American heritage.

Indigenous People's Day—Oct. 10

Tribal nations occupied the territory now known as the mainland United States for centuries before the first European explorers and settlers arrived. In fact, these Native Americans had populated the continent from the Atlantic to the Pacific, and from the Gulf of Mexico to northern Canada.

Since 1968—when Gov. Ronald Reagan signed a California resolution calling for an "American Indian Day" to honor and celebrate their traditions, cultures, and contributions—several states have followed suit. These include Nevada, South Dakota, Wisconsin, Washington ("Native American Heritage Day"), and Tennessee ("American Indian Day"), with varying dates. In 2021, President Joe Biden signed proclamations declaring that both <u>Columbus Day</u> and <u>Indigenous People's Day</u> be celebrated on the second Monday in October.
